Carolina &c In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas Bolton of  
Lars — being though indisposed of body yett off perfect and sound —  
praised be God do make and ordaine this my last will and Testimant  
in manner and forme following. In the first place unto my loving friends  
Thebe Codner the sum of ten pounds ame acknowledgement of the underhand  
care of and aiding late wife in both our sicknesses. Item. I give to the Congre  
gation of my friends here in Carolina the sum of ten pounds to be by them  
paid out as they shall see fit about the burying of the friends or the burying place  
and building a little house to shelter people from bad weather or inclemency.  
Item. Give unto my negro man Augustus manumit him with the expiration  
of two years after my decease a reasonable sume that he maye not  
not exceeding two years. Item. I give and ye unto the trust fund eyng  
aforesaid in truste and all the monies soe raised to charitable uses  
that is to say the maintenance of the poor & indigent to be committed to the  
trustee of the congregation of my friends here in Carolina by them proposed  
of a hundred and fifty pounds yearly to be payed by them to those  
in distress to see by their report & discretion. Item. The rest & residue  
of all and singular my estate both real & personal to be payed among debts  
and other charges and legacies in the sume of one hundred & five pounds to  
the quill clerke in this province to be payed after my decease  
shortly before my death sume to remaine to him to be payed to the hole  
summe to the executors hereafter named when they have received itt of Benjamin  
Harris of this Province Master & ap't his payeth itt all severall payment by  
as by virtue of a bond of one hundred & fifty pounds payable to me my heirs Executors  
to he is obliged until itt sume be fully payed. Item. I give to Benj: Dawson  
of this Province the sume of eight pounds to be payd by my said Executors indifferently affre  
ing to whom. Item. I give & bequeath unto my son Benjamin Harris the sume of six  
pounds to be paid in six months after my decease as afores. Item. I give & bequeath  
unto Richard Scott of this Province widow the sume of forty shillings to be  
paid in six months after my decease. Item. I give & bequeath unto thomas Rose  
of this Province the sume of forty shillings to be payed after my decease as afores  
affreid. Lastly. All the rest residue of my money goods & chattells whatsoever  
the same giftes & bequeath unto Mr Samewell Williamson & Mr  
Richard Scott sons of this province whome I do nominate & appoint to be  
my sole Executors of this my last will & testament afores written hereby revving  
all former wills att any time by heretofore made. In testimony whereof I have  
hereunto set my hand & seal & published & declared this to be my last will &  
testament the eighteenth day of June in the year of our Lord God one thousand  
six hundred ninety & four.

Christian being sick & weak in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory do make  
& ordaine this to be my last will & testament in manner & forme following (viz)  
first & principally I command my soul into the hands of Almighty God & give  
unto him my body to be decently buried & w<sup>t</sup> earthly estate God hath  
been pleased to bestow upon me I desire & bequeath as followeth. Item. I give  
bequeath to my son Robert Adams in England (Iafaline) this heirs the sume  
of one hundred pounds and if the said Robert Adams be deceased then  
I give & bequeath the said One hundred pounds to my well beloved brother  
John Adams his heirs forever. The sume of one hundred pounds to be  
paid by my executors hereafter named when they have received itt of Benjamin  
Harris of this Province Master & ap't his payeth itt all severall payment by  
as by virtue of a bond of one hundred & fifty pounds payable to me my heirs Executors  
to he is obliged until itt sume be fully payed. Item. I give to Benj: Dawson  
of this Province the sume of eight pounds to be payd by my said Executors indifferently affre  
ing to whom. Item. I give & bequeath unto my son Benjamin Harris the sume of six  
pounds to be paid in six months after my decease as afores. Item. I give & bequeath
