No 2 South Carolina. In the Name of God Amen. Peter Painter of
 Berkeley County in Province of South Carolina being very sick
 & weak in body but of sound mind & memory prepared to give to Almighty
 God for the same. And considering the uncertainty of this transitory life
 do make and declare this my last will & testament in manner & form
 following. First I bequeath my soul into the hands of my Redeemer
 Jesus Christ hoping through his atonement for salvation & remission
 of my sins, and my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried
 at the discretion of my friends hereafter mentioned in full hope of a
 joyful resurrection at the last day. And for my estate which I have
 pleased God to bestow upon me, I do hereby give and dispose
 of the same as follows. Inprimis I will that my just debts &
 ſpēcial expēces ſhall be firſt paid and diſcharged and that my
 perſonall eſtate be forthwith ſold in order thereunto. Item I will
 (in caſe my perſonall eſtate be not ſufficient to pay my juſt debts and
 otherwiſe) that my real eſtate be ſold alſo by my execut^r hereafter na-
 med. Many perſon or perſons whatſoever willing to purchaſe of ſame.
 Item I will that the reſidue of my eſtate after my debts are paid be
 ſold in money lands or houſes be divided equally between my loving wife
 Mary Painter my daughter Hannah Painter but in caſe my daughter
 Hannah Painter ſhall die before the age of fifteen years then my will is
 that the whole of my ſaid eſtate deſcend to my ſaid wife & her heirs and
 aſſignes forever. Laſtly I do nominate & appoint my loving wife
 Mary Painter ſole execut^r of this my laſt will and teſtament recd by
 all

all former & other wills or wills by me hereto fore made. I declare & pronounce
 this writing to be my laſt will & teſtament. In Witneſs whereof I have ſub-
 ſcribed & ſigned hereunto with my hand & ſeal in Charles Towne in South
 Carolina this twenty ſecond day of Auguſt in the year of our Lord one
 thouſand ſeven hundred and nine.

 by the ſaid Peter Painter as his laſt will & teſtament in
 the preſence of Jacob Croshaw - John Riddle - James Magyok.

Before me the Hon^{ble} Johnſon Turberville Esq^r on this fifteenth day of
 September Anno Domⁱ 1709 personally came & appeared John Riddle & James
 Magyok two of the ſubſcribing Witneſſes who on their ſolemn oaths on the
 Holy Evangelists taken ſay that they were perſonally preſent and did ſee
 Peter Painter the above teſtator ſign ſeal publish and declare the
 within written to be his laſt will and teſtament & that the ſaying thing
 he was of ſound & perfect mind & memory to the beſt of their judgment &

No 30 South Carolina. In the Name of God Amen. I Thomas Try late
 of Berkeley County of Bristol Merchant being at present sick and weak of
 body but of sound and perfect mind and memory thanks be to God for the same
 do make and declare this my last will and testament in manner and form fol-
 lowing. That I bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God
 hoping through the merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ forgiveness of all my sins
 and my body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my friends
 hereafter named and of my worldly goods I dispose as follows (my just debts
 and funeral charges being first paid and satisfied). First I give devise
 and bequeath unto my loving friend George Took late of London Gent^l all
 that my Schooner named George now lying at an Anchor in the harbor of
 Charles Towne together with all her mast-yards sails anchors cables
 rigging and appurtenances whatsoever thereto belonging to the
 only use and behoof of him the said George Took his heirs and assigns
 forever. Item I give and bequeath all the rest and residue of my
 Estate both real & personal wheresoever the same is to be found unto
 my dear by beloved wife Elizabeth Try and to my son Thomas Try equally
 to be divided between them share and share alike. And my will is that
 all such part of my Estate whether real or personal that shall be allotted
 for my said son Thomas when a dividend thereof is made shall be
 used and employed by my said wife in and for his maintenance and
 education until he attain his age of twenty one years. And I desire
 my said wife Elizabeth shall happen today before my said son Thomas
