Thomas Greatbeach

In the Name of God Amen the twenty eighth day of November in
the year of our Lord one thousand six hundred sixty four. I Thomas
Greatbeach of the Province of Carolina being at present afforned and
perfect memory God to Praise for it, And being desirous to settle
affairs in this world do make and ordaine this my last will and testa-
ment in manner following that is to say first and principally
Commanding unto Almighty God my maker and Redeemer assynd
trusting that I shall receive full pardon & remission of all my sin-
es and be saved by the precious death & merit of my Saviour Jesus Christ
in whom & by whom I trust to be saved & redounde my body raised again
at the day of his General resurrection and placed amongst the blessed saints
in Heaven the body committ to the Earth wheresof it comes to be buried
according to Christian burial at the discretion of my Executors hereafter
named and notwithstanding such worldly Estate as the Lord in mercy
hath sent me my will and meaning is that the same shall be influy-
ed and be stawed hereafter in this my will is expressed. And first
I do make remonence frustrate ordaine to void all wills by me for-
merly made and do declare and appoint this my last will and Testament.
Item. I do will and ordaine that all those debts & duties as I do owe
of right or conscience to my maners or persons whatsoever
shall be well and truly accounted and payed or ordained to be paid
within convenient time after my decease and without any trouble
by my Executors hereafter named. Item. I give the wealth to my
son Daniel Greatbeach all my land or lands house or houses
that doth properly belong to me in Carolina or elsewhere to have all
my weareing clothes all my silver buckles & buttons with the two
gold rings I commonly did wear in my lifetime. I do likewise
give and bequeath unto my son Daniel aforesaid all my stock
of sheep excepting those that in this my will is hereafter given
I bequeath. I do also give and bequeath unto my said son
Daniel Greatbeach the moiety or half part of (all my stock of)
cattle of cow & cow kine and also the moiety or half part of
all my stock of swine Likewise my best gun being a fuzier and
boynets Catouch box sword spittoll and likewise I do quiet
bequeath unto my son Daniel Greatbeach the moiety or half
part of all my household stuff as peper brass com

and all other utensils belonging to housekeeping, with three silver plates.
Likewise leaving the aforesaid said Sonn Daniel the moiety or half part
of all my stock of slaves with all other things which through forgetfulness or
other wise is not specified in this my will. Likewise I give and bequeath
unto my son Daniel aforesaid my two mares with their increase excepting
the first foal which shall come from either of them. A mare I have given
bequeath unto James & the son of James Greatbach. Also a mare I have given
bequeath to my daughter Ruth Greatbach. The moiety or half part of all
my stock remains unto me to be sold as stock cattle of
cattle and swine and with them in value and what by same I have done
before you Benjamin aforesaid trustee for a young wife auring
together with her gold rings and her apparel and whatsoever the
moiety or half part of it my daughter Ruth Greatbach shall have
bedding linens and all other articles of household furniture to be sold
given & bequeath unto my son Daniel the moiety or half part of all
within six months after my death in the same manner as the above items
unto my son Daniel as aforesaid. And I give and bequeath unto my son
particular my stock of cattle and swine and what by same I have done
between myself and Ruth Greatbach my daughter and my daughter
my son Daniel the moiety or half part of all my stock of cattle in being
when so levied upon him. And I give and bequeath unto my son
Sonn Daniel the moiety or half part of all my stock of cattle too
cows to be determined thereby to be sold as aforesaid. And I give and bequeath
considerable less than happen in my stock of cattle and swine. And I give
well and ordain that in case of my son Daniel the moiety or half part
and better and more part of the same to be sold with all else to my
daughter Ruth Greatbach as aforesaid. And I give and bequeath to her
altogether to sell, or give away for her own use or use of her
with her child or children whom she may then have or who
would be named. And I give and bequeath to my son Daniel the moiety or half part
unto my said child Ruth Greatbach. And I give and bequeath to my stock
of cattle, cattle, hogs, sheep and all other animals living and dead move
able and immovable same as aforesaid in so much as I can make such
him as my son in law Thomas Cowman when he shall come to be of
twenty years and then to be of sound mind and of sufficient memory
of the produce of all that shall be in the same at the time of his birth
two children of Daniel and Ruth Greatbach to be born before
my said son Daniel & Ruth Greatbach shall die otherwise. And I ordain and
appoint my son in law Thomas Cowman when he shall come to be of
age of eighteen years to be my sole Executor. And I give and bequeath to him
carily for the performance and payment of what hequates & legacies in
this my will specified until that my aforesaid Son Daniel doth
come to the age of eighteen years, and then that my said Son Daniel
doth take all pertaining to himself & his wife Ruth into his care and
management until his said wife shall be married or annexed to the
age of eighteen years which shall first happen but if it should happen
that any of my said children should die before he or she shall shall

accomplish the age of eighteen years mentioned in this his makes part we desirous the
aforesaid Son Daniel Greatbach shall have his full share according to his
fortune that my son Daniel Greatbach shall all waste land his full share
in the divisions according to will of my estate. Lastly I do will ordain and
appoint my trusty and well beloved friends the Williamses James Miller
and with Benjamin Lamball to be Executors to this my last will and testament
until my son in law Thomas Cowman shall arrive to the age of eighteen
years and then if he be capable of managing and performing the present
trust of an Executor and do give in sufficient security aforesaid he
my said Son in Law Thomas Cowman to be my Executor until my said
Daniel Greatbach doth accomplish the age of eighteen years and then
he may said Son Daniel to be my sole Executor but if it should please
God that both my son Daniel and daughter Ruth should decease
before they arrive to the age and time before specified then I do give and
bequeath unto my son Daniel Greatbach and half of my aforesaid
estate belonging to me unto my brother Roland Greatbach of Bermuda
widow Son Daniel Greatbach and half of my aforesaid estate,
James Stark and mother Ruth's unto my Son & daughter in law
Thomas and Felicia Cowman. Finally it is my will and meaning
that my executors Benjamin may see and mind & shall all where in
mentioned and bearing in this my last will and testament be perform
ed and fulfilled by my executors before mentioned. And I do hereby
desire to appoint Mr. Richard Scott and George Young & George Lamball
to be executors in place of either my last will & testament. Testitress
Son in Law Thomas Cowman with my hand sealed the day before aforesaid
the 28th day of December 1795
Signed sealed published declared,
The words following stock right on the
middle one line, and the words
Great part in the one hundred line, any other side interlined before
beginning sealing in presence of, and the words (and half of my aforesaid
estate) with the birth line on this side, interlined before signing sealing.
At Hamptons Harbor Son Daniel Stark - The mark of H. Langhiggenworth

Tuesday even before me Hammah Foster, Hammell Stark & Hugh Wiggleworth
and made oath that they were personally present and did see and hear the
above named Thomas Greatbach sign & seal & publish the above written
will to be his last will and testament. And that he was of sound mind
and memory at same time. Given under my hand this 14th day of
March 1795
