No. 8 South Carolina In the Name of God Amen. I George Fullerton of Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina Merchant being  
sick in body but of sound & perfect mind & memory give my last will and  
Almighty God for the same Considering the certainty of death and the  
uncertainty of the time thereof do make & containe this my last will & testa-  
ment in manner following First I bequeath to my Son into the hands  
of Almighty God my Merchant in trust my effects to him  
as becometh him to receive & turn into Charles Town my hopeing  
assuredly believing the salvation of my soul through the alone merits  
of Jesus Christ my blessed Saviour & my body to commit to the Earth to be  
duly buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named being  
in full certaine hope of a resurrection to a glorious immortality in the  
great day of our Saviors Second Coming to Judge the world storing  
estate which it hath pleased God to bestow upon me in this world I do give  
& dispose of the same as followeth etc. Imp<sup>r</sup> I will that all my just  
debt & funeral expenses shall be first paid & discharged Item I do give  
decease & bequeath unto William Rhett Junr (son of William Rhett of  
Charles Town Merchant) his Executors Administrators & assigns forever the sum of  
two hundred pounds curr<sup>t</sup> money of Carolina. Item I do give & bequeath  
to Sarah Rhett daughter of the said William Rhett her Executors  
Administrators & assigns forever the sum of two hundred pounds curr<sup>t</sup> money  
of Carolina. Item I do give & bequeath to Catherine Rhett daughter  
of the said William Rhett her Executors Administrators & assigns forever the sum of two  
hundred pounds curr<sup>t</sup> money of Carolina. Item I do give & bequeath to  
William Rhett Senior & Sarah his wife their Executors Administrators & assigns  
forever the sum of two hundred pounds curr<sup>t</sup> money of Carolina. And I do  
also give & bequeath to the said William Rhett & Sarah his wife their  
Executors Administrators & assigns forever the sum of one hundred pounds  
Sterling money of England which have now lying in the hands of Mr.  
Robert Smith of London Merchant. Item I do give & bequeath to  
the said Sarah Rhett wife of the said William Rhett her Executors  
Administrators & assigns forever my negro boy called Brown Hill. Item I do

do give & bequeath to the poor of the Parish of St Phillips Charles Town the sum  
of twenty pounds curr<sup>t</sup> money of Carolina to be disposed at the discretion of my Execu-  
tors hereafter named. Item I do give & bequeath to the minister or  
Rector for the time being of the parish of St Phillips Charles Town the sum of two  
pounds curr<sup>t</sup> money of Carolina. Item All the rest & residue of my estate of land  
& otherwise to whomsoever lying open I do give & bequeath the same to my  
loving brother Mr. William Fullerton living in the Shire of Ayre with  
the west of Scotland his Executors Administrators & Assignees forever. Item I do hereby  
nominate & appoint my loving friends William Rhett of Charles Town  
Merchant & Sarah his wife to be my Executors of this my last Will & Testament & do  
hereby these presents revoke renounce frustrate & make void all former wills &  
testaments heretofore made & do hereby declare & appoint this to be my last  
will & testament the eighth day of October in the twentieth year of the Reign  
of our Sovereign Lady Anne by the Grace of God of Great Britainne France  
& Ireland Queen Defender of the faith &c. & in the year of our Lord God  
one thousand seven hundred & eight  
Signed sealed published & declared by the  
above named George Fullerton to be his  
last will & testament of his executors of  
Henry Cooke Henry Pearce Sarah Cooke.

Hickburn in the County of Berkley being weak of body but of sound  
& perfect mind & memory do ordaine this my last will & testament in man-  
ner and form following. First & principally command my soul into  
the hands of Almighty and my body to be decently buried at the discre-  
tion of my Executors hereafter named and as for the disposing of my  
temporal estate as it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow on me I  
give & bequeath as followeth. First I will that my debts & funeral charges  
shall be first paid. Imp<sup>r</sup> Item I give & bequeath unto my loving  
wife Hester Hubbard all my Estate both real and personal during  
her natural life, but not to sell nor dispose of anything without her
