No 8 South Carolina In the Name of God Amen. I George Pullar-
ton of Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina being
sick in body but of sound & free mind & memory give & bequeath
to Almighty God for the same considering the uncertainty of death and the
uncertainty of the time thereof to make testament this my last will & testa-
ment in manner & form following. First I bequeath my soul into the hands
of Almighty God my merciful Father of Jesus Christ my blessed Redeem-
er beseeching him to receive ^{the} same into his hands & his mercy hoping
assuredly believing for salvation & my soul through the alone merits
of Jesus Christ my blessed Redeemer my body to commit to the Earth to be
decently buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named being
in full & certain hope of a resurrection to a glorious immortality in the
great day of our Saviours second coming to judge the world for my
estate which it hath pleased God to bestow upon me in this world I do give
& dispose of the same as followeth viz. Imp^o I will that all my just
debts & funeral expenses shall be first paid & discharged. Item I do give
devise & bequeath unto William Rhett Jun^r (son of William Rhett of
Charles Town Merch^t) his Executors Administrators assigns forever the sum of
two hundred pounds Curr^{nt} money of Carolina. Item I do give devise &
bequeath to Sarah Rhett daughter of the said William Rhett her Executors
Administrators assigns forever the sum of one hundred pounds Curr^{nt} money
of Carolina. Item I do give devise & bequeath to Catherine Rhett daughter
of the said William Rhett her Executors Administrators assigns forever the sum of two
hundred pounds Curr^{nt} money of Carolina. Item I do give devise & bequeath to
William Rhett Jun^r & to Sarah his wife their Executors Administrators & assigns
forever the sum of two hundred pounds Curr^{nt} money of Carolina. And I do
also give devise & bequeath to the said William Rhett Sarah his wife their
Executors Administrators assigns forever the sum of one hundred pounds
Sterling money of England ^{which} I have now lying in the hands of Mr
Robert South of London Merchants. Item I do give devise & bequeath to
the said Sarah Rhett wife of the said William Rhett her Executors
Administrators assigns forever my negro boy called Snowball. Item I do

do give devise & bequeath to the poor of the Parish of St. Phillips Charles Town the sum
of twenty pounds Curr^{nt} money of Carolina to be disposed at the discretion of my Execu-
tors hereafter named. Item I do give devise & bequeath to the ministers
Rector for the time being of the parish of St. Phillips Charles Town the sum of twenty
pounds Curr^{nt} money of Carolina. Item All the rest residue of my estate of land
or nature is now or hereafter lying or being I do give devise & bequeath unto my
loving brother Mr William Fullerton (living in the Shire of Ayr in the
west of Scotland his Executors Administrators assigns forever. Item I do hereby
nominate & appoint my loving friends William Rhett of Charles Town
Merchant Sarah his wife to be my Executors of this my last will & testament & do
hereby by these presents revoke renounce frustrate & make void all former will &
testaments hitherto made & do hereby declare & appoint this to be my last
will & testament this eighth day of October in the seventh year of the reign
of our Sovereign Lady Ann by the Grace of God of Great Brittain France
& Ireland Queen Defender of the faith &c. & in the year of our Lord God
one thousand seven hundred & eight
Signe sealed publish & declared by the
above named George Pullerton to be his
last will & testament in presence of us
Century Locke Mary Pearce Sarah Locke.
