will and testament to dispose of my real and personal Estate as
followeth: Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my loving wife Anna
Cranford to her heirs forever nine hundred pounds English money
one horse called Bear one feather bed and furniture one negro girl
named Phillis. It is to be known my mind is ill that my said loving
wife shall live on my place a time yet at my own discretion for admo-
-nition. Item. I give and bequeath unto my oldest son Peter Cranford to his heirs
forever my dwelling house and plantation containing two hundred
and ten acres of land and five hundred acres of land in Calleton County in
Wingard river. Item. I give and bequeath unto my sons John Richard
James Isaac and to their heirs & assigns forever to be equally divided
among them four hundred and fifty acres of land in Berkley County
and fifteen hundred and ten acres of land in Calleton County and
unless any of my youngest son shall die before they attain the age of
twenty years then their shares of my real Estate shall be equally divided
among

among the survivors of them and in case my eldest son Peter shall die before
he attain the age of twenty years that then his share of my Estate shall be equally
divided among his surviving brothers. Item. It is my mind and will that
all the remaining part of my Estate shall be equally divided among my sons
Peter John Richard James Isaac that is to say there shall be a will made
made as often as any of my said Sons shall attain the profferty year and
an equal part of the same delivered to them or some of my Sons that shall
at which time they shall also receive their share of my real Estate. Item.
it is my mind and will that the yearly proffit of my Estate shall either
be let out at interest or laid out in slaves for the benefit of my sons as my Esrs.
think fit except such a part as is necessary for the maintenance & clothing
of my Sons and the charges of the plantation. and I do nominate & appoint
my loving friend Capt. W. B. Bull able Executor of this my will during his
life and after his decease to my desire that Mr Richard Moody & Mr
Barnaby Bull shall be Esrs. to have the management of my estate till my
sons are of age and increase. Mr Richard Moody aforesaid or the R. Barnaby
Bull shall see before my Sons Peter & Will. Bull that their brother William
Bull shall nominate another in the place of such &c. Capt. Brown to do so
with like care all former other wills by me at any time made &
desire this to be my last will and testament. In witness whereof

and principally being heartily sorry for all my sins past I commend my soul to Almighty God my Creator hoping and assuredly believing that by the death & merits of my blessed Saviour Jesus Christ I shall have full and free remission of all my sins and my body to commit to the Earth to be decently buried according to the discretion of my Executors herein after named and touching the worldly estate which it hath pleased God to bestow upon me my will is that the same shall be disposed of as hereinafter by this my last will is declared and set forth. I command my will is that all my just debts as also my funeral expenses be paid by my Executors hereinafter named, and whereas short time after my decease I have given & bequeath unto my loving friend Joseph Bloody of Summerville Town in the County of York and State of South Carolina four negro and Indian slaves to Christopher Newell and Henry St. John to hold the said four negro and Indian slaves to them increase unto the said Christopher Newell and Henry St. John and my wife and bequeath unto my son of the name of Bloody of Summerville above mentioned all my household goods & furniture & to hold the same to them & their heirs & assigns forever & to my executors & trustees to make my loving friend Peter Simons to receive & hold the same & to pay him his just debts and expenses & to bequeath unto him the same & to whom which I desire to give & bequeath the same to be his sole & only bequest. Item. I do hereby make & declare that my debts & personal be the sum of one hundred & twenty dollars & to be paid by my executors of this my last will & testament to my son Joseph Bloody & to my personal friends Joseph Bloody and Christopher Newell & to my said loving friends Peter Simons and Christopher Newell & to my executors to bequeath to them each to consult & appoint the said Christopher Newell and Peter Simons to be my just will & testament. In witness whereof I have caused to set my hand and seal to the twenty second day of April in the year of our Lord Christ One thousand seven hundred and forty two & in the town of Summerville, State of South Carolina. First and principally I recommend my soul to Almighty God my creator assuredly believing that I shall receive full pardon and remission of all my sins and bestowed by the precious death & merits of my blessed Saviour and Redeemer Christ Jesus and my body the Earth from whence it came to be buried in such decent but not profuse) manner as my Executors & Esq^r hereafter named shall be thought meet and convenient and as touching such worldly estate as the Lord in his mercy has been pleased to bestow upon me my will, devise, intent & meaning is the same that the employed and bestowed as hereafter by this my will is expressed. Item. I^r my will devise & meaning is that all debts due to me here and in all other parts of the world to George as also the rest of the slaves a manumis from the labor of the slaves on the plantation on Stone's Island where I now reside and the slaves on the plantation formerly called "Summerville" by the name of Mr. Stone where my son George resides and has the management thereof shall be appropriated and held by him & his wife & children & to the payment & discharging my just debts and that negligence hereafter by my executors or devision of any part of my estate made shall be performed & executed until my said debts be fully paid & paid as above. Item. I^r my will and devise also is that both myself and my wife Christiane be and I do hereby ordene the same to receive out of the produce from the labours of the slaves of both the plantations before mentioned until the debts be fully paid and satisfied. But in case any of them should be desirous of having the same hereafter given that then (soe otherwise) their legacies shall be obliged and I do hereby oblige them severall of them to pay out of their legacies a proportionable part of my said debts that shall be then owing as shall be computed by my Executors & Esq^r hereafter named. Item. I^r I give and bequeath unto my dear well beloved wife Martha Logan nineteen slaves (after my just debts are fully paid and discharged as above) by name George, Maria, Jupiter, Hoping, Jack, Jeffrey, Cyrus, Pompey, Blackwall, Mercury, Venus, Fortune, James, Adams, Eliza, Judith, Phillis, Amy, Marcella, Amorall & Betty w^t their increases. I also give and bequeath unto my said loving wife all the household goods ardding along
