

Memorandum. The twenty sixth day of June 1892. I Thomas Smith of  
of Carolina being of perfect memory understanding do make and ordain  
to be my last will & testament in manner & form following. I give  
bequeath unto my Sonnie George Smith his choice of one of my more enter younger  
old which he liked best with my second best saddle and bridle. I give  
unto my Sonnie George all my wearing apparell as well linen as woollen I like  
shape to. I do also give unto my Son George Smith all my brick house in  
Charlestown cont. four rooms one above another with convenient passage  
to and from it to him and his heirs and assigns forever. I give unto my Son  
George all my instruments that belongs to Chirurgery and one half of all my  
instruments and one half of all my books of what nature or kind so ever as also one  
wether bedd two pair sheets two blanketts one rug two pillowes and one bolle  
I do give my large brass mortar & pestle Also one silver porgenger two silver spoones  
my small silver turecked two small silver salts six knives and six calves  
and twenty pound current money of Carolina to be paid unto my said Sonnie  
George within three months after my decease by my Executors hereinafter named as  
also seven leather chairs and one cedar table board and thirtie shillings  
current in late times. I give and bequeath unto my grand sonnie  
Thomas Smith my large silver turecked to be nevertheless used by my Son  
George during his life repaired by him. I give unto my faithfull  
warranted both Joseph Blake for a remembrance of me my silver tobacco box.  
I do also bequeath unto all the rest of my goods real and personall chattles  
unto my said Sonnie Thomas Smith his heirs & assigns forever, whom also  
I make to be my sole executor of this my last will & testament excepting what  
shall be paid unto both Joseph Blake by my Executors and Sonnie Thomas Smith  
within the six month said Son George within four months after my decease  
I do earnestly pray and request the said both Joseph Blake to be the overseer  
of my said Son George untill he shall be twenty one years  
of age. Witness my hand & Seal the 26 day of June 1892
