 utterly disavow, revoke and disallow all and every other former testament
 wills and legacies bequests and Executors by me in any way before this time
 named, willed and bequeathed, ratifying and confirming this to be
 my last will and testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand
 and seal the day and year above written.

Memorandum that on the 17th day of November 1720 I personally came and

 published and declared the within will and testament as aforesaid for her last
 will and testament and are to be taken notice of as such. Signed

 mind necessary of the same being.

BB South Carolina. In the County of York. I, John Sibley, do hereby certify that
 the within named Sarah Sibly of York County in the Province of South Car-
 olina. Planted hereon in body full of good memory thank be
 to Almighty God and desiring to recommend the immortality of her
 life and that all flesh must yield unto death when God shall please will
 do make constitute ordain and declare this my last will and testament in
 manner and form following reciting and remembering by this a land
 and declared either by word or writing. And this only is to be taken
 for my last will and testament. First and principally from the bottom
 of my heart for all mine sins most humbly begging forgiveness through the
 mercy of Jesus Christ mine only Redeemer for the same. First I commit
 my precious soul unto Almighty God my Creator Saviour and Redeemer
 and my body to be buried as my Executors shall think fit. Item. I leave
 that all my debts may all justly and truly be paid with convenient
 time after my death. Item. And for the settling my temporal estate
 and

and such goods shall be as it shall please God. far above my debts to be
 mine. Also order and desire for mine Executors and Administrators. First
 Nathaniel Broughton Thomas Waring Isaac Percher son and my dear
 wife and daughter's Berdety whilst she shall continue a widow. Item. I
 give and bequeath unto my dear beloved son Theodore Berdety my plantation
 called by the name of Black Berry containing twelve hundred acres of land
 or thereabouts in 3 plots never to be sold but to go and be for the use of his
 male of the body of my son Theo^d and if no male to the female and if my son
 should dye without issue then the aforesaid plantation to go and be for my
 daughter Mary and if no male of the body of female or female.
 And if my said daughter should dye without any issue after her body then the
 said plantation to go and be for my wife Eliza or the next heir. I also desire that
 my wife Eliza that she may live on and manage the aforesaid plantation with
 the remainder a widow till my son Theodore be of age. And if my
 aforesaid wife Eliza remains then I desire my Executors and Administrators
 Nathaniel Broughton Thomas Waring and Isaac Percher son to have the
 sole care and management of my estate and pay in a convenient time to
 my wife Elizabeth out of the plantation's revenue or produce the sum of
 five hundred pounds current money of this Province. Item. I give and
 bequeath unto my daughter Mary a plantation containing five hundred
 and sixty acres of land called by the name of White all and a thousand
 pounds current money of this Province which I pray my aforesaid Executors
 and Administrators to pay her when of age or married; out of the plantation's
 revenue and also that all mine whole estate that shall be found
 in negroes Indians mulattoes or any other slaves, two girls excepted one
 named Bop for my wife Eliza and one piece for my daughter Mary
 both negro girls till the rest of my whole estate of shall remain that
 be and remain for my dear beloved son Theodore Berdety when of age. I
 give also a mare and a horse to my wife Eliza and a mare and a horse
 to my daughter Mary out of my freed estate may be found. Item. I pray
 mine aforesaid Executors and Administrators to divide equally the revenue or
 produce of the aforesaid plantation or estate between my son Theodore
 Berdety and my daughter Mary after that the aforesaid five hundred
 pounds shall be paid unto my wife Eliza and eight hundred pounds to
 my daughter Mary. Item. I give and bequeath unto each of my
 Executors and Administrators a gold ring and a riding horse and to
 my brother Peter Percher a gun and my pistols and a gold ring and
 to my sister Marianne and Susanna each of them a gold ring.
 Item. I give and bequeath unto my godson Isaac Percher son to
 my brother Isaac Percher a couple of my best breeding mares. In
 witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this twenty
 day of May Anno 1720.
