 arrive to the same, at which time the aforesaid houses and lot shall be
 equally divided between my said loving wife and my loving children
 (vizt) Joseph Will, George Will, and that said Joseph shall then
 enjoy his part of the same until his heirs forever and so of like sort
 each when arrived to age shall enjoy his and her part and their
 heirs forever, provided nevertheless the said houses and land shall
 not be sold by any one enjoying the same forever, but shall
 descend continually to the longest liver and in case my said loving
 children Joseph Will, George and Mary should happen to die before
 they arrive at age, then and in that case my loving sons Thomas
 and John shall be possessed of the same and their heirs forever
 and for want of such an heir then to my loving brother John Bee
 this heirs and for want of such an heir then to the nearest kin and
 so continually to descend forever. Item I give and bequeath unto my
 loving sons Thomas and John that part or lot which was left me by my
 loving sister Mary Franklin to be equally divided between them, and
 to continue in them and their heirs forever, and for want of such
 heirs then to descend unto the nearest kin and so give and bequeath
 unto each of my sons Thomas and John one half of my working
 tools, one gun and one silver spoon. Item I give and bequeath
 also unto my loving wife the use of the three following slaves
 (vizt) Dick, Bluffy and Lewis till such time as my son Joseph
 shall arrive at age, and then he shall enjoy a fifth part of the
 profits of said slaves over the rest as they shall grow up and arrive
 at age but the slaves never to be sold but to continue so long as
 in case of the lot and houses given. Item I give and bequeath
 unto my loving wife all and sundry in the household goods that I
 am now possessed of to be enjoyed by her during her natural life
 and afterwards to be equally divided amongst all my loving
 child^{ren} then living. Item I do hereby nominate ratify and my
 loving brother John Bee & my said wife both of this my last will
 & testament. In witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and
 seal, the day and year above written.

 his last will & testament in the presence of

disposing mind and understanding to the best of these Deponents
knowledge and these Depon^ts further say that their names sett

these witnesses are often overhandwriting, and that they
together wth John Smith & Benj^d. Davis subscribed their names
the "Testators". Hence, and at his request, I wrote it March 1798.

H. R. The last will and testament of Timothy Bellamy Bundelett to his
 No 1. In the Name of God amen. I Timothy Bellamy of Connecticut
 in the Province of South Carolina Merchant being sick in body but
 of sound and perfect mind and memory Praise be therfore given
 heartily, God do make and ordain this my last will and testament
 in manner and form following. (That is to say) first and principally
 I commend my soul into the hands of Almighty God hoping through
 the merits death and Passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have
 full and free pardon and forgiveness of my sins and to inherit
 everlasting life and my body I commit to the Earth to be decently
 buried at the discretion of my Executors hereafter named
 And as touching the disposition of all such temporal estate as
 it hath pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I give and dispose
 thereof as followeth. Impth I will that my debts and funeral
 charges be first paid and discharged. Item I give and bequeath
 unto my daughter Sarah Bellamy all that part of a town lot
 situate lying and being in Charles Town and distinctly known in
 the middle of the said Town by the number (twelve) containing
 in front thirty six foot or thereabouts and in depth ninety nine feet
 or thereabouts butting and bounding to the Eastward on land
 belonging to Mr. Isaac Wazjick to the Westward on land now or
 lately belonging to Mr. John Ceroskeys to the Northward on said
 Broad Street together with the messuage or dwelling house thereon
 and all and singular the outhouses Edifices buildings gardens
 fences and other the premises to the same belonging in many
 wise appertaining to hold the same unto my daughter Sarah
 her heirs and assigns forever. Item I give and bequeath unto
 my daughter Mary Bellamy all that part of a town lot No ()
 and messuage thereon situate in Charles Town aforesaid on the
 North side of the said Broad Street containing in front thirty
 feet or thereabouts and in depth one hundred feet or thereabouts
 butting and bounding to the Eastward on land now belonging
 to Mr. Joseph Wazjick to the Westward on one other lot belong-
