I give & bequeath unto John Lawes one negro man after the decease of my said wife Cecilia provided of said John Lawes makes over of land adjoining to me which lies out to one of his daughters Ann or Dorothy but if the said John Lawes refuses to give the land to one of his children aforesaid then Jordon & negro to be sold by & money to be divided between my two sons William Wates and Henry Fawell.

4th Item. I give & bequeath unto my two grandchildren Ann & Dorothe Lawes after the decease of my said wife two Indian girls Nelly & Nancy.

5th Item. I give and bequeath unto my daughter Elizabeth one hundred pounds per annuum of this Province to be paid by Mr Wates after my wife's decease.

6th Item. I give & bequeath unto my son Henry Fawell of halfe of all my goods chattles & slaves horses cattle &c excepting what are given away abovesaid after my decease of my said wife Cecilia Husbands. 7th Item. I give & bequeath unto my son William Wates this house and land I now live on to him his heirs forever and the one half of all my slaves horses cattle goods and chattles excepting what was given to John Lawes & his daughter, always provided he pay my daughter Elizabeth Hubbard one hundred pounds at his payment that is twenty pounds per annum after my wife's decease.

8th Item. And further my will is of my daughter Elizabeth should be married to the minister that my son Wates shall in his paying anything to my daughter Eliz. but the afforesaid hundred pounds shall be equally tendered between my son Fawell my said son Wm Wates.

9th Item. I give unto Hugh Blay all my writing Apparatus & twenty six things in money perannum after my decease.

8th Item. I give & bequeath unto my son Ernest & Ruth Gibbes & their children & their issue twenty shillings per year and also my day rents, less sum to make void all former wills & testaments by me hitherto made in writing whereof I have herunto set my hand bear the County side day of August 1770

I John Thomas of Charles Town in the Parish of St Phillips and Province aforesaid being weak of body but of perfect memory thanks be to Almighty God for his sake and calling to remembrance the uncertain state of his troublous life and that all flesh must yield unto death without place had to call do make constitute ordaine & declare this my last will testament and testaments will and Will hereof by me made and declared either by word writing or both to be taken only for my last will and testament notwithstanding that And principally I command my soul to Almighty God my Creator & my beliefing that by the death and merits of my blessed Savioe Jesus Christ I shall have free remission of all my sins And my body to the Earth to be buried in such Christian manner as to my Executors hereafter named shall be thought convenient And as concerning such worldly estate as it hath pleased God to bestow upon me my will is this the same shall be employed therewith as hereafter by this day will dont express. Item. I will give and bequeath unto the minister chosen & appointed by the French Church in Charles Town for the time being so long as their Beaumons that both preach in the same the sum of five pounds currant money to annual. Item. I will and bequeath unto the Poore of Charles Town twenty pounds currant money. Item. I will give & bequeath unto my friend Mr Peter Gillow Cooper in Charles Town twenty pounds currant money. Item. I will devise give & bequeath unto my loving wife Mary one third part of all my real estate (to witt) House and houses lands & cements &c during her natural life and after her decease I give & bequeath the same to her three daughter Mary Wragg Judith Dubose & Ann Dubose to be equally divided betwixt them & each of them lawfully begotten of their bodys for me. Item. I will give & bequeath unto my said loving wife Mary (After my just debts and funerall charges and also the legacies by me herein given & bequeathed) one third part part of all my personal estate goods chattles &c to her and at her disposal. Item. I will give & bequeath unto the said Judith Dubose the sum of eight hundred and forty two pounds currant money to be paid herout of the remaining two thirds of my real & personal estate. Item. I will give and bequeath unto the said Judith Dubose the sum of eight hundred & forty two pounds currant money to be paid her out of the remaining two thirds of my real and personal Estate. Item. I will devise give & bequeath what shall remaine of my real Estate (to witt) house and houses lands & cements &c to be equally divided betwixt the said Mary Wragg Judith Dubose and Ann Dubose for them and their heirs forever. But if please God either of the said Mary Wragg Judith Dubose or Ann Dubose should happen to die without issue lawfully begotten of them either of them the said part of the Estate shall go to the next lawfull heirs survivors of them and each of them equally divided between them. Item. I will give and bequeath unto the said Mary Wragg Judith Dubose and Ann Dubose the remaining of all my personal Estate to be equally divided betwixt them two. Item. I will give and bequeath unto Thomas Lendall the sum of five pounds to be paid him out of
