Smith of Carolina Merchant my true & lawful Attorney for me & in my name and for my use to ask demand & receive of William Ruff of Carolina Mainior One Woman by name Joviana, five boys named Jaruto & Jathu and one man Slave and all sums & Sums of money due owing & payable unto me for them either or any of them or upon any other Act and upon non delivery or paym^t thereof of S^r William Ruff his Executors or Admin^{rs} for me & in my name to sue arrest imprison imploade & prosecute for Same & upon such Suit to proceed to Judgm^t & execution & thereupon of S^r William Ruff his Exors & Admin^{rs} in prison to hold & keep in paym^t thereof to be made with all costs & damages Sustaynd & to be Sustoynd by reason of if deteyning of if Same, and upon paym^t thereof of S^r William Ruff his Exors & Admin^{rs} forth of prison to discharge And acquitances for if Same or any part thereof for me & in my name to make Seal & deliver, & also to doo perform & execute all & every other lawfull & reasonable acts & things whatsoever both for obteyning & distarayning of if Same as shall be needfull to be done, Giving & by these presents granting unto my S^d Attorney my full & absolute power in the premises, Ratifying & holding firm all & whatsoever my S^d Attorney shall lawfully doo or cause to be done in & about if premises by virtue of these presents. In witness whereof I have here unto set my hand and Seal the twelfth day of August in if second year of the Reign of our Sovereign Lady Ann by the grace of God of England, Scotland, France & Ireland Queen Defender of if Faith &c Annoq; Dni 1703.

Know all men by these presents that I Thomas Barber of County of Middlesex in the County of Middlesex am hold a family bond unto Robert Stevens of if County of Middlesex Gent. in y^e full & just sum of eighty four pounds Curr^t money to be paid to if Robert Stevens his Exors, Admin^{rs} or assigns, to if 10th paym^t well & lawfully to be made I bind myself my heirs, Exors & Admin^{rs} firmly by these presents sealed wth my Seal & dated this eleventh day of March An^o Dni 1703.

The Condition of if obligation is such, that if I abovewritten Barber his heirs Exors or Admin^{rs} or some of them shall & do well & lawfully pay or cause to be paid unto if abovewritten Robert Stevens his certain Attorney Admin^{rs} or assigns the full & just sum of two & forty pounds in Lawfull m Spanish plate pieces of eight not weighing less than thirteen penny weight at five shillings if either or more of eight, at or upon if twenty eight day of the next ensuing if date thereof without fraud or further delay. Then this obligation to be void, or else to remain in full force & virtue sealed and delivered in if presence of David Jones. Henry Wigington.
