Know ye That Jonathan Evans formerly belonging to the Shipp Advent Gally whereof Capt. William Kidd was Commander, being willing to free himself from that wicked Practise of Life which in y<sup>e</sup> said Shipp was practis'd and in order to gaine & sett himself for his most sacred Majesties gracious Pardon which by His Royall Proclamation given at his Court at Kensington the sixth Day of March 1702 in the thirteenth year of His Maesties said promise to all Persons which at any time within twelve months after y<sup>e</sup> date of the said Proclamation shall repair to any of His Maesties Justices of the Peace and Commanders in the said Proclamation mention'd and before them or any of them make affidavit of the Pyracies committed by the Shipp or vessel where to they did belong and which shall have the same, Know ye That y<sup>e</sup> said Jonathan Evans hath repaired unto the said James Moore & hath made affidavit of all the Pyracies committed by the Shipp whilst he did belong to y<sup>e</sup> same and of all Pyracies by at any time committed before the sixth Day of June 1701. AND further hath surrendered himself to me the said James Moore, and have hereunto sett my hand and Sealed my seal with armes this thirteenth of September 1701. D<sup>o</sup> 1701. Regit<sup>o</sup> Regis Gulielmi III Regis Ang<sup>o</sup> Scotiae &c XIII: at shew Town on Ashley River in South Carolina. Ja: Moore.

To all to whom these presents shall come I James Omb of London but now resident in Charles Town in y<sup>e</sup> Province of South Carolina Merchant and Grocer Whereas Benjamin Nicoll John Crope Patrick Walsh & Giles Been of London Merchants owners of a Ship called the Cole & been lately about a month of August 1699 fitted out y<sup>e</sup> said Ship & Bills of Lading her with sundry Goods & Merchandises mentioned in y<sup>e</sup> said Bills of Lading her bound for y<sup>e</sup> Islands of Teneriffe, Saurry & from thence to South Carolina and whereas the said Ship & barge arrived at South Carolina in the month of December next following was there seized and Condemned by y<sup>e</sup> sentence of y<sup>e</sup> Court of Admiralty held for y<sup>e</sup> said Province on the third & third day of January following on pretence of her not having a Certificate or Register in forme according to an act of Parliament made in y<sup>e</sup> seventh & eight years of y<sup>e</sup> Reign of His late Majesty King William the third Entitled an act for preventing frauds and Regulating abuses in y<sup>e</sup> Plantation Trade which sentence was afterwards by order of Council bearing date y<sup>e</sup> thirteenth of July in y<sup>e</sup> year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & one made upon a Report from y<sup>e</sup> Right Honourable y<sup>e</sup> Lords of y<sup>e</sup> Committee of His late Majesties most Honourable Privy Council for hearing Appeals from y<sup>e</sup> Plantations upon hearing y<sup>e</sup> appeal of y<sup>e</sup> said Benjamin Nicoll John Crope Patrick Walsh & Giles Been from y<sup>e</sup> said sentence & all orders & all issues thereupon returned and whereas y<sup>e</sup> said Benjamin Nicoll John Crope Patrick Walsh and Giles Been by one Instrument or letter of Attorney bearing date y<sup>e</sup> fifth day of September in y<sup>e</sup> year of our Lord one thousand seven hundred & one did ordaine constitute & appoint unto y<sup>e</sup> James Barber to be their true & lawfull attorney for them & in their Names & to their use to aske Demand Leavy me for recover & receive of & from Elizabeth Colake of South Carolina Widow y<sup>e</sup> Relict & Executrix of Joseph Colake Esq: late Governour of Carolina Edmund Bellingier of y<sup>e</sup> said South Carolina Esq: Informer against y<sup>e</sup> said Cole & Been Gally and her barge and Thomas Croughton of y<sup>e</sup> same Place Esq: collector of y<sup>e</sup> Customs for y<sup>e</sup> said Province either of their Execut. or administrators and alio of & from any other Person or Persons whatsoever full Recompence Restitution & satisfaction for y<sup>e</sup> said Shipp Cole & Been Gally and her barge & all Debts Dues
