The Condition of this Obligation is Such y^e if y^e above bound Thomas
 King his heirs Executors Administrators and assigns or any of y^e do and shall
 well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto y^e above named Thomas Forster
 his Executors Administrators or Assigns y^e full and just Sum of three
 hundred in Lyon Dollars of five shillings y^e Dollar or Pieces of eight
 each weighing 13 Penny weight: att or upon y^e 31 day of August which
 shall come and be in y^e Year of our Lord 1700. without fraud or
 further Delay y^e y^e Obligation above written to be void or else to remain
 in full force and Virtue
