Ordained Constituted & Appointed & doth in & by these presents in our place &  
stead doth make Ordain Constitute & Appointe James Duba of Carolina Mer-  
chant our true & lawfull Attorney, & in Case of y<sup>e</sup> Death or absence of y<sup>e</sup> said James  
then we do appoint Robert Gage of Carolina our lawfull Attorney Giving  
by these presents Granting unto our said Attorney or either of them full power  
for us in our names & to our use to ask demand sue for Levy require receive  
& receive of & from George Daw & George Span of Carolina & of from  
every person or persons whatsoever in Carolina & for all & every Sum  
Sum of Money Goods Wares & merchandizes which shall be due owing  
Payable or Belonging to us by or from any Person or Persons whatsoever  
upon recovery or receipt thereof to give due & sufficient Discharge  
if same for us & in our names to appear in any Court or Courts  
before all Lords Judges & Justices there to answer defend & reply  
all matters & Causes to do say sue & pursue Implead Rejoinder  
arrest Imprison & to Condemn & out of Prison again when need shall  
to deliver Ratify all owing & holding for good & Lawful M<sup>ts</sup> whatsoever  
our said Attorney or either of them shall lawfully do or Cause to be done  
or about y<sup>e</sup> Premises by Virtue of these presents In Witness whereof  
have hereunto sett our hands & Seals in Port Royal y<sup>e</sup> 19<sup>th</sup> day of Dec<sup>r</sup>  
in y<sup>e</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> year of y<sup>e</sup> reign of our Sovereign Lord William the Third King  
of England &c. Anno 1700.

& Admors by all lawfull waies & means to Cause to be & appear before  
any Judges or Justices in any Court or Courts either of Law or Equity  
and y<sup>e</sup> said Simon Valentine his Executors & Admors to sue pursue Implead  
Perse Rejoinder Attach Imprison & Condemn & on paym<sup>t</sup> thereof forth  
again to deliver & release & one or more Acquittances or Acquittances  
or other sufficient Discharge & Discharges in my name & due form  
to make Seal & Deliver And Generally in & about y<sup>e</sup> Premises  
to do all & whatsoever shall be requisite as fully & amply as all law  
and purposes as y<sup>e</sup> said Constituant himself might or End do if power  
With Power to Substitute one or more Attorneys or Attorneys under him  
The said Jacob Means hereby Promising to hold for good & valid all  
& whatsoever shall be lawfully done in & about the Premises

 constituted & appointed by these presents to make, Ordain constitute & appoint  
 our trusty friend Michael Coles Master of y<sup>e</sup> Good Ship friends Adventure to be  
 our true & lawfull Attorney for us & in our names & for our use to ask demand  
 recover & receive of & from James Rubee of South Carolina Mariner, all & every  
 such Sum & Sum of Money debts, dues goods, wares claims & demands  
 whatsoever as it appertaining unto us or either of us as Executors to y<sup>e</sup> said William  
 Coles deceased, or otherwise howsoever & upon non payment thereof y<sup>e</sup> said James  
 Rubee his Executors & Admors for us & in our names to sue arrest, Impound, seize  
 & prosecute for y<sup>e</sup> same & upon such Suit to proceed to Judgment & Execution, &  
 thereupon y<sup>e</sup> said James Rubee his Executors & Admors in prison to hold & keep  
 Paym<sup>t</sup> thereof to be made with all Costs & damages sustained & to be sustained  
 by occasion of y<sup>e</sup> Detaining of y<sup>e</sup> same, And upon Paym<sup>t</sup> thereof y<sup>e</sup> said James  
 Rubee his Executors & Admors forth of Prison to discharge & Acquittance for y<sup>e</sup>  
 same or any part thereof for us & in our names to make, Seal & Deliver
