Seing my selfe my Heires Execut. and admitts firmly by these presents signed with my hand & sealed with my Seal. Lately this nineteenth day of August 1694 in

The condition of the above written obligation is such that if the abov'd bound James Alford, his Heires Execut. and admitts doe and shall well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the said Abraham Parris, or to his certaine Attorney his Execut. admitts or assignes the full and just sume of Sixtie Two Pounds two shillings Current money of Carolina upon demand without fraud or duencion then the above obligation to be void, or else to stand remaine and be in full force and virtue.
