Act for y^e Naturalizing of James Dufay
(Theodore Johnson and Others)

Humbly Sheweth

Excellent Majesty, y^e Lords Spiritual & Temporal & Commons in this
Pres^t Parliament assembled, James Dufay, Son of James Dufay by
Judith Doguier his Wife, born at Bologna in France, James
Le Serurier, Son of James Le Serurier, by Elizabeth Lyce his wife
born at St. Quentin in France, & others being all Persons borne out of
his Majesties Allegiance, first Professing y^e true Protestant Religion
& having given good Testimony of their humble Dutifull & loyal
Affections to his Majesty & y^e Good of y^e Kingdom of England. That
it may be enacted & be it enacted by y^e Kings Most Excellent
Majesty, by and wth y^e Advice & Consent of y^e Lords Spiritual &
Temporal & y^e Commons in this Present Parliament assembled & by
y^e Authority of y^e same, That James Dufay, James Le Serurier &
Others before us henceforth adjudged & taken to all Intents & Purposes
naturalized & as if born of this Kingdom of England & they are y^e shal
be from henceforth, adjudged reputed & taken to be in every Condition respect
& degree, as free to all Intents & Purposes & Constructions as if they &
every of y^e had been & were born wth in this Nation or Kingdom of England
And be it further enacted, Declared & Ordained by y^e Authority afores^d
of y^e P^r James Dufay, James Le Serurier & others, shal be & are
hereby enabled & adjudged able, to all Intents, Purposes & Consti-
tutions, to soever as well to Demand, Challenge, & ask, take, retain
have & enjoy any Mannors, Lands, Tenements, hereditam^{ts}, & all
other Privileges & Immunities, belonging to y^e People &
Natural Subjects of this Kingdom, & to make, buy, sell, or their heirs
or Pedigree, as heirs to him, her, or their Ancestors, Lineal or Collateral
Heirs of any Descend, remainder, reversion, right or Title, Conveyance,
Legacy or bequest to soever, w^{ch} may or shall from henceforth, here
remain, revert, accrue, or grow unto y^e, & every of y^e as also from
henceforth to have, retain, keep & enjoy all Mannors, Lands, Tenements,
& hereditam^{ts}, w^{ch} he, she or they, may or shall have by way of
Purchase or Gift of any Person or Persons to soever as able to

Charter, Privilege, Maintenance, Power & Jurisdiction all and all
Manner of Actions, Suits, Causes and all other things
to do as lawfully, liberally, freely & surely, as if they y^e
James Dufay, James Le Sauvage & others & every of
Badenborn of English Parents within this Kingdom of
England, and as any other Person borne & derived of English
Parents wth in this Kingdom may lawfully in any wise do
any Law, Act, Statute, Provision, Custom, Ordinance or
other things to be or, had, & made Done, Promulged
Proclaimed or Provided to y^e Contrary thereto in any
wise Notwithstanding

unto Captⁿ William Rhett of y^e Province Marins in the
Sum of One Hundred and fifty three Pound, Seven Shilling
and six Pence Curr^t moneys of Carolina to be paid to y^e said
William Rhett as his certain Debts, Executⁿ & Administrative
or Assigns to wth Paym^t well and truly to be made I am
my self, my Heirs, Executors and Administrators firmly by
these Presents bound In witness whereof I have hereunto
set my Hand and Seal this 5th day of Feb^r Anno 1699

The Condition of this Obligation is such, That if y^e above
bounden Thomas Dalton, his Heirs, Executors or Administrators
and do well and truly Pay or cause to be paid unto y^e above named
Captⁿ William Rhett his Executors or Administrators the
Sum of Seventy Six Pound, Thirteen Shilling and Nine pence
Curr^t moneys of Carolina at five Shilling each for Dollars or

Spanish Plate Piece of Eight weighing Fourteen penny
weight at or upon y^e fifth day of June next Ensuing y^e
hereof without fraud or further Delay, than this Obligation
to be void and of none Effect, or else to be & Remane in full
force & vertue
