pounds thre pence & half pence first Money of Carolina given by  
Rene Ravenell of County before presenting & delivery of these presents  
well & truly & in hand paid whereof And Whereas I John Gaillard do  
acknowledges me self to be fully satisfied Contented & paid & thereof & of every  
part & parcel thereof do fully & clearly release Acquit & forever discharge from  
Rene Ravenell his heirs Executors & Administrators by these presents That I have given grants  
granted ~~to~~ to Alain Bargainet Salomon Giffard & Cuthbert Price Do  
fully Clearly & absolutely give grant Demise alien Bargainet Salomon & Confirm  
unto said Rene Ravenell his heirs & Assignees all that parcel of Land containing  
four hundred acres of Land Bounding to y Northward on Land known  
to y Eastward on y Lands of y said Rene Ravenell to y Southward on Land not less  
out to y Westward on Land laid out unto Mr Francis Egmont alias granted  
me y said John Gaillard y morn & twenty fifth day of March anno 1700 by  
honor of Lord Prop of this Province as by said Grant may fully appear  
Together with all houses Edifices Buildings orchards gardens meadows feeding pastures  
Woods, underwood, hedges, fences, Waters, Water Courses, easements  
privileges & Commodities whatsoever to y said Land now belonging or pertaining  
now standing, growing or likely hereafter shall stand grow or be in  
or upon y premises. I John Gaillard do the same for four hundred acres of Land  
with y house, edifice, buildings, orchards, gardens, meadows, feeding pastures,  
woods, underwood, hedges, fences, waters, watercourses, & with profits, mind  
& commodities whatsoever in other y said premises & every part & parcel thereof to  
y said Rene Ravenell his heirs, Executors & Assignees forever. And I y said John Gaillard  
do for myself my heirs, Executors & Administrators Covenant, Promising to y said Rene  
by these Presents, that he y said Rene Ravenell his heirs, Executors & Assignees shall  
lawfully, may peacefully & quietly have hold occupy possess & enjoy y said four  
hundred acres of Land & all in singular other y said lands bargained premises in that  
least, like, trouble, eviction, expulsion molestation or Interruption of me y said John  
Gaillard my heirs, Executors & Administrators or any other person or persons whatsoever claiming  
from or under me, them or any of them by any wayes or meanes whatsoever. And that  
y said John Gaillard have in me self true title, undoubted right & lawfull  
Authority to sell & rebargained premises as every part & parcel thereof to y  
said Rene Ravenell his heirs & Assignees for ever. The witness whereof I have here

This Indenture made y twenty seventh day of January in the  
fourth year of y reign of our Sovereign Lord William King of England &c. Anno D<sup>r</sup> 1700  
Between James Deall of St Albans Blackfriars London of y one part & Thomas Gorster  
of London Mariner of y other part Witneseth That y said James with consent of his  
friend hath & by these presents doth bind & put himself an Apprentice & Servant  
to y said Thomas to serve him or his Assignees in y Plantation of Carolina beyond y Seas  
for y space of four years next ensuing y Arrival of y said Servt in y said Plantation  
And doth hereby Covenant well & truly to serve his said Master in his lawfull Ygns  
in y said Plantation for y direing y said Term according to y Laws & Customs of y said  
Plantation & doth further declare & Covenant that his y said Servt at y time of the  
enacting hereof is of y Age of seventeen years as in y person & no Contraid  
& Contracted Servt to any other persons or persons And y said Master doth  
himself his Executors & Assignees In consideration thereof doth hereby Covenant  
Pormis & Agree to & with his said Servt that he y said Master or his Assignees  
shall & will at his & their own proper Cost & Charges with other Conveniences  
they may Charge & Convey or cause to be Charged & Conveyed over unto y said  
Plantation his said Servt & from henceforth during y said Plantation  
also direing y said term & at y end thereof shall & will at y like Cost & Charges  
provided for & allow his said Servt all necessary食肉 meat drink washing  
lodging & other necessary fitt Conveniences for him according to y Custom of  
y said Plantation & as other servt in such Cases are usually provided for a servant
