 and Surviving Brother & Heir of Benjamin Pierpont late of
 Charles-Town in South Carolina in America Clerk deceased and Executor
 of his last Will & Testament. & I Benjamin Pierpont of New-Haven
 in the said Colony of Connecticut Clerk and Surviving Brother
 of the said Benjamin Pierpont do hereby constitute, make, ordain, constitute and appoint, and do hereby constitute, make, ordain, constitute & appoint my trusty friend Robert
 Fenwick of South Carolina aforesaid. Clerk to be my true, sufficient &
 lawful Attorney for me, in my Name & to my Use in both or either
 of my Capacities aforesaid to Enter into & upon & Possession to Take of
 all and singular such Land, Tenement & Hereditables lying or being
 in South Carolina aforesaid with all of Right belongs to my said Brother
 Benjamin Pierpont at the Time of his Death, & with all & ought
 now to Descend & Accrue to me by Constitution, Trust, Name
 to Demise, Grant, Bargain & Sell for such Sum & Sums of money
 and for such Term & Terms of Years as my said Attorney in Per-
 son or by his Instructions to be by me unto him given in that respect
 shall think fit, And in my Name to make Seal & Execute
 the Deeds or other Writings necessary for the said Purposes, Granting
 or conveying of the same unto the said Benjamin, his Heir, Executors
 & Receive all and singular such Debt & Debts, Sum & Sums of
 Money, Good, Ware, Repay, Effects, Rents & Emoluments or
 Rent & other Estate whatsoever which were due, Owed or belonging
 unto my said Brother at the Time of his Death, & now payable or belong-
 to me by Constitution in either of my Capacities aforesaid from any
 Person or Persons in South Carolina aforesaid by any manner of
 writ or Means whatsoever. And upon his Receipt of the said sum
 or any Part thereof Acquittance or other sufficient Discharge
 for me & in my Name to make, Seal & Execute Writings & hereby
 granting unto my said Attorney my full & whole Power & Au-
 thority in & about the Premises And to take & Use all proper way
 & Means & Course in the Law (if need be) for the obtaining and
 Recovery of the same. And for me to Appoint any Person or
 the said Constitution in either of my Capacities aforesaid to Represent me
 in any Court or Courts and before any Judge, Justice or other Officer or
 Ministers of the Law whatsoever. All one or more Attorneys and
 one or same again at Pleasure to Revocate. And General
 that all & whatever shall be requisite & necessary in & about

Premises as fully, amply & Effectually to all intents & Purposes
 as I myself might or could do being personally Present. And
 Ratifying, Approving & Holding for Good & valid for ever & as
 whatsoever my said Attorney or his Substitutes shall lawfully
 do or cause to be done in or about the Premises by Virtue
 of these Pres. In Witness whereof I James Pierpont
