Due and Owed to them or any other wayes, And doe hereby Declare my
self fully Contented & satisfied, And this to the said John Townson
Doe and ought to Doe as much as they the said William White
and John Smith, Have paid & to be performed all things requirable
of them from me with great Fidelity, Exactnes and Industry, And
testimony of this you know and Voluntary Discharge to the said
William White & John Smith their Heires Executors Administrators
assignes, to the said John Townson have hereunto sett my hand
the this twenty eight day of May 1665 Dated then in

 To all people to whom these presents shall come to be bound
 or shall be it knowne & made manifest by this Publique
 Instrument of Protest that Thomas Gibbs Master of the Sloop
 called the Surveys & John Count Mate Joseph Stiles & John
 Mariner & others in the aforesaid Sloop upon the Sea about
 the last of Churly Ewe & Churly Mincks North & on or abt
 the eighth day of October Instant Anno Dni 1669 being
 bound with the said Sloop from the Island of Barbadoes
 to the Island of Bermudas & thence to the Island of Barbadoes
 sundry goods according to Charter part & Bill of Lading
 respectively mentioning the said goods did then & thence
 together with a very violent storme which grew & durd
 continued during the forme of six dayes in which time
 our provisions water & fards being very much spent & our
 lost wee with the Advice of the rest of our Company on Board
 thought it expedient & necessary for us to make the best of
 our way for Carolina to which place wee were also bound
 fording coast by longer boording wee should wholly spend
 our provisions & wreck our vessel & hazard & lose the
 utter overthrow of our whole voyage & in consideration of
 the prodigious violence & continuance of the aforesaid storme
 & the being on board several goods perishable & subject to
 damage & that the above mentioned persons are apprehensive
 & damage may be sustained by the violence of the said storme
 do solemnly protest agt the wind & sea for the same as it moveth
 or be as alle for all damages that may by any means
 be done by any means of the air or water into the aforesaid
 Island of Bermudas further & concerning the said storme
 but are wholly ignorant of any damage otherwise
 sustained then as is aforesaid in this Instrument sett forth
 in this Justum & expressed in testimony of the truth
 & in the name of the same persons before mentioned & what
 names are hereunto subscribed have given their testimony
 in and found of Law. Dated at Charles Towne the twenty
 second day of October Anno Dni 1669.
