

Letters Testamentary to Charles Burnham granted to his son Charles Burnham.

By the Honble Arthur Middleton Esq^r President and Commander in Chief in and over his Majesty's Province of South Carolina, to all whom this Presents shall come Greeting.

Know ye that on the ~~xxxx~~^{xxxx} day of July in the year of Our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Twenty nine, the last Will and Testament of Charles Burnham late of this Province deceased, was shown approved and allowed of, the said deceased having whilst he lived and at the time of his decease, divers Goods Rights and Credits within the Province aforesaid, by means whereof the approbation and allowing of his Testament and the power of granting the Administration of all and singular the Goods, Rights, and Credits of the said Deceased, and also the auditing the accounts Calculations and reckonings of the said Administration and the final Dismission and Discharge from the same to me, is manifestly known to belong. The Administration of all and singular the goods Rights and Credits of the said deceased, and his Testament any way concerning hath been hitherto committed unto Mary Burnham, Widow and Executrix of the said Charles Burnham deceased during her widowhood according to the Testator's Will. Letter of Administration to Daniel Mac'Eury granted to Leonard Dobbin
By the Honble Arthur Middleton Esq^r President and Commander
in Chief in and over his Majesty's Province of South Carolina
and Ordinary of the same.

To Leonard Dobbin of Charles Town.
