 Be it knowne and manifest unto all that who shall see these presents or hear the
 Same Read that on the Twentieth third day of October Anno Domini 1716 and
 in the Third year of the Reigne of our Sovereign Lord George by the Grace of God
 King of Great Brittain France and Ireland - Defender of the faith &c.
 Before me James Duromidge Notary & Tabellion publick Residing in London
 by Regall authority duly admitted & sworn & in the presence of the witnesses
 hereafter named personally appeared Andrew Percivall of London Esq. who
 Declared that whereas M^r. Joseph Morton of South Carolina Gent Died by his
 Letter bearing date there the Thirtieth of September 1715 advise him the said
 Appraiser that he could not Remitt him the ballance of M^r. T. Rans acct.
 M^r. Leary having such power that afterwards the Said Leary told him the
 S^r. Morton that he was willing the Said Morton should himself Remitt
 the monies which the said Morton owed to him the said appar the
 ballance whereof Remains in the Hands of Said Morton amounting to
 four hundred and fifty eight Pounds Twelve Shillings & nine pence money
 of Carolina Therefore he the Said Appraiser Declared by these presents

 by the best method as shall be most conducive to the Profit & advantage
 of him the Said Constituent and for so doing the said appraiser ~~Doth~~ Doth
 hereby Declare that these presents shall be a Sufficient Power Warrant & Judic-
 iation & the said Appraiser Doth hereby also Declare upon Receipt of the
 said Sum of Four hundred and fifty Eight pounds Twelve Shillings & nine pence Carolina
 money as afores^d or the full Value thereof by him the said appraiser that he will
 for that Sum of Four hundred and fifty Eight pounds Twelve Shillings & nine pence Carolina
 money as afores^d or the full Value thereof by him the said appraiser that he will
 Joseph Morton shall Repute for that purpose a full and Sufficient Acquittance
 and Receipt do and for the use of the Said Joseph Morton of all Claims & Demands
 touching & concerning the Said monies so to be remitted and Received as
 afores^d the Said Appraiser promising to Ratify confirm & hold for good & valid &
 about the premises by virtue of these presents this done & passed in London
 in presence of the under written Witnesses.
