my said Husband's and now of Right belonging to me and to receive & take
to the possession thereof for my use and on payment of the said Rent money
or profits in respect thereof to give sufficient Discharges and on
non payment to sue prosecute for the same and ^{to} do and Execute all
other acts & deeds whatsoever for the receiving and discharging of
the said money and accounts and also for taking to and receiving
the possession as fully and Effectually to all intents and purposes
whatsoever say as I my self might do in my own proper person hereby
ratifying Confirming and allowing all and whatsoever my said Attorney
shall lawfully do in my ^{own} premises by Virtue hereof In Witness whereof
I have hereunto set my hand and seal on the 25th day of August in the
^{second} Year of the reign of o^r Sovereign Lord King George our Great Britain &c.
