 and charged upon his Estate and we do hereby Seal and
 Grant unto our Said Attorney and in case of his Death
 or absence then to of Said William Gibbon & Andrew Allen
 full power and Authority in our names not only to
 adjust and determine the aforesaid Matter but also upon
 any agreement by them to be made to convey Lands
 in Carolina aforesaid to the Value of the aforesaid Sum
 of Two hundred pounds and Every part thereof Giving
 and by these Privies Granting unto our S^d Attorney
 and in case of his Death or Absence then to the aforesaid
 William Gibbon and Andrew Allen our full and whole
 power Strength and Authority to act and do in the
 Premises as full largely and ^{amply} ~~compley~~ to all intents
 and Purposes as if we our Selves were personally present
 to act and do therein and Attorneys one or more unto them
 for the purpose aforesaid do make them at Pleasure to revoke
 hereby Ratifying allowing and confirming all and whatsoever
 our S^d Attorney or in case of his death or absence then
 what the said William Gibbon and Andrew Allen
 shall Lawfully do or cause to be done in and about
 the Premises not only as to the adjusting and determining
 all matters in Differences depending between us and the
 aforesaid Arthur Foster and Mary his wife but upon settling
 the Same to convey in our names Lands to the ~~Value~~
 Value of the aforesaid Two hundred pounds and all other
 matters and things wh^osoever relating to the premises which
 they shall Lawfully do or cause to be done by Virtue of
 these Privies in witness whereof we have hereunto sett
