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May it Please your Honour,

The Royall South Sea Comp^y of Great Britain hath been pleased to appoint me here in this City & for this Island their agent or Factor and being Desirous to contribute as much as I can in my power to the good advantage of your Province, have sent for the Comp^y Interest and Carolinias advantage. Sent the Rearr. Henry Capt. Domingo Romero master of the Sloop Sacred Family to your Port and in order to Defray his Port Charges have sent for the Royall Assiento Company's Vessel, one Tunn weight of Sugar and Twelve Persons of blood, Beside money all which the said master is to convert in Negroes & provisions w^{ch} he thinks will Turn to best acct. for said Royall Comp^y there being an Act of Parliamt^t for Introducing any Slave that shall be recd in the Spanish West India into any of our English parts (only) paying the duties as if Imported by any of our English Vessels and from any English part, makes me pray the favour Your Honour will please to admitt. him to the same Rights and privileges as any other English Vessel at being the Contract wth Spain & undoubtedly will prove Carolinias Advantage w^{ch} no one knows better then your Self & be assured the Govern^t of this Island will be always Ready to shew any Favours to any Ship belonging to your Province that shall call in att this port.

I pray Your Honour will send me a List of the negroes that were taken in the Vessels that were on the wreck from Carolina with the masters names the day of the month, and place where taken and by whom, the Losers may depend on Restitution and I give my word for such Negroes as are now in my possession as least. Parris and Mr. Craskeys shall be returned as soon as the Comp^y Orders arriv w^{ch} I expect at being fully known such negroes could not be. Prizd to the Spaniards & so of course not to y^r Comp^y. Wee have now Cruising of this port two Large Sloops who are Privateers that formerly belonged to Jamaica who took a Packett Boat from Spain about Ten days ago worth about Twenty five thousand Pounds Sterling. I have nothing of news to inform I should be glad of having it in my power ^{to} to serve You & Remain
