 decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter
 named and as touching the disposition of all such Temporal
 Estate as it hath Pleased Almighty God to bestow upon me I give
 and Dispose thereof as followeth.

Imprimis I will that my Debt and Funeral Charges
 shall be paid and discharged.

I then I give and bequeath unto my loving sons a Tract
 of Land lying in Calcuton County.

I then I give to my eldest son John Brauford two Hundred
 Acres of Land part of the said Tract containing five
 hundred and sixteen acres be it more or less.

I then I give to my son William Brauford one Hundred
 and sixteen acres of the said Land.

I then I give to my son Joseph Brauford one Hundred Acres
 of Land of 4th & 5th Tract.

I then I give to my son Benjamin One Hundred Acres of
 Land part of the said Tract, to be given to each of them
 at twenty one years of age; and provided any of them dye
 under age their parts of Land shall return to 4th Two
 Youngest sons.

I then I give to my sons Thomas Brauford & Ezekiel Brauford
 two Hundred fifty five acres of Land in another Tract be it
 more or less (that is to say) One Hundred and Thirty Acres of
 Land for my son Thomas part of the said Tract.

I then and the other one Hundred and twenty five which
 remains I give to my son Ezekiel Brauford to be given them
 at twenty one years of age.

I then I give to my daughter Anne Brauford one Feather Bed^d wth
 Roaster Shete B. Laitket and rugg and one Negro Girl called
 Sarah to be delivered to her at Eighteen years of age,
 or day of Marriage which may happen first.

I then I give to my Daughter Mary Brauford one Feather
 Bed.
