The Last Will and Testament of M^r John Hollibush
Date y^e 3^o day of Apr^l 1722. (Vide Bundle CC N^o 114).

In the Name of God Amen I John Hollibush
of Berkeley County in the Province of South Carolina
Carpenter, being sick & weak of Body but of a sound
perfect mind & memory give & bequeath to Almighty
God, do make and ordain this my present Last Will &
Testament in manner & form following (That is to
say) First and Principally I commend my Soul unto the
Hands of Almighty God Hoping through the merits
Death & Passion of my Saviour Jesus Christ to have
full and free pardon and forgiveness of all my sins &
do inherit everlasting life and my Body I commit
to the Earth to be decently buried at the discretion of
my Executors Hereafter named and Touching the disposi-
tion of such Temporal Estate as it hath Pleased Almighty
God to dispose upon me I give and dispose thereof I
as followeth I Imprison's Duell that my debts and
funeral Charges be paid and discharged.
Item - I give and bequeath to my son John Holly-
bush all that Plantation whereon I now dwell toge-
ther with all and singular the Messuages, Houses, Out-
Houses, Enclosures, Buildings and all other things
therunto belonging or any ways appertaining to him
and his Heirs Lawfully Begotten Forever.
Item I give unto my aforesaid son John and his Heirs for
ever one Town Lot that I bought of Thomas Cary as is
specified by a Bill of Sale.
Item I give and bequeath to my beloved wife Mary
Hollibush about Fifteen Pounds the one half part of debt
which is about Thirty Pounds due from her son Thomas
Jackson to me, and the other half part I give & bequeath to

 the final discharge and discharge from the same to me is

 Concerning was committed unto M^r. Thos. Barton, M^r. Geo. Benson &
 Joseph Waters named Exors in the said Will & Testament
 being first sworn on the holy Evangelists well & truly to
 administer the same and to make a full & perfect In-
 -ventory of all and singular the Goods, Rights and Credits of
 the said Deceased and to Exhibit the same unto the Secretary's
 Office at Charles Town at or before the Twenty Eighth
 day of September next Ensuing, and to render a true & just
 Account Calculation and Reasoning thereof when therunto
 required -
