These are to authorize and
empower you whose name are hereunder written to
repair to such parts and places within that part of
this Province that lies from Cape Fear South and
West as you shall be directed unto by Daniel Gurn
Esq^r Administrator of all and singular the goods, rights
and credits of Joseph Perkins late of Berkeley County
in the said Province deceased whereever any of the
goods of the said deceased are or do remain within the
said parts and places which shall be shown to you by
the said Daniel Gurn and there view and appraise
all and every the said goods, being first sworn on
the Holy Evangelists to make a full and perfect
Inventory and appraisment thereof, and to return
the same under your hand (or of any three of you)
unto

Secure payment of the said sum of three hundred and
 sixty five pounds ten shillings as also for the further considera-
 tion of the sum of Five shillings to me in hand paid by the
 said Henry Peronneau have Given, Granted, Bargained, Sold
 and in Plain & Open Market Delivered & by these Presents
 do fully freely and absolutely Give, Grant, Bargain, Sell and
 Relieve unto the said Henry Peronneau three Negro men
 named Cuffy, Harry & Mingo and two Negro women
 named Peggy and Nancy unto the said Henry Peronneau
 his Executors, Administrators and assigns and his & there
 proper Goods & Chattels and to his & there own proper
 use benefit and behoof forever; Provided always and
 upon this Condition notwithstanding that If I the said Peter
 Bacot my heirs executors administrators or sum of us shall
 do well and truly pay or cause to be paid unto the aforesaid
 Henry Peronneau, his Certain Attorney Executors Admin^{rs}
 or assigns the aforesaid sum of three hundred & sixty five
 pounds ten shillings Avant money at such time as the
 same ought to be paid according to the purport True
 Intent and meaning of the said recited Obligation and
 Petition for the Redemption of the before mentioned Negroe
 Slaves then this present deed of bargain and sale & every
 thing herein contained to be utterly void and of none effect
 but in default of payment of the said sum of three
 hundred and sixty five pounds ten shillings be made by
 me the said Peter Bacot in part or in all or by my heirs
 Executors Admin^{rs} or any of us at the time when the same
 ought to be paid that then and from hence forth it shall
 and may be Lawfull to and for the said Henry Peronneau
 his Executors Administrators or assigns or any of them

Memorandum

This Seventh day of May Anno Domini 1722 Personally
came and appeared before me Samuel Peronneau & John
Jeffords who being duly sworn on the holy Evangelists
of Almighty God by John Barksdale Esq: one of his
Majestys Justices assigned for Berkeley County made Oath
that on the day and year within expressed they were
Present and did see the within named Peter Bocat sign
Seal & deliver the within mentioned deed to the use
therein mentioned & one of the ^{within named} negroes also
delivered one part of the rent and these deponents did sign
their names as witnesses thereof to the within deed.
