Nicholson may give and transmit to the said
Society a full, particular and confidential
account thereof, that the said Society may be
the better enabled to discharge the great
Trust reposed in them by a discharge of
the Glory of God, the Honor of His Majesty
and the Spiritual Good and Welfare of His
Subjects in those parts. In Witness Whereof

affixed their common seal the seventeenth
day of October in the Seventh Year of
his said Majesty's Reign Anno Domini 1720.

understanding do make and declare this my last
and testament in manner following (viz) First
of all I recommend my Soul unto the hands of
Almighty God Hoping thro' the merits of our Saviour
Jesus Christ to obtain everlasting life, desiring to be
buried in a Shoar in a decent and Christianlike
manner and after my debts and funeral charges
are paid I dispose thereof as followeth -
I give and bequeath unto Mrs. Mary Myatt my
loving wife all my estate both real and personal
let it consist in any respect whatsoever.
In Witness Whereof I have hereunto set my hand
and put this thirteenth day of November Anno
Domini 1718 in the Fifth Year of the Reign of his Majesty
King George the second annulling all former wills by me

tioned I am in my mind & will and
I do hereby order and appoint that my
executors hereinafter named and ye survivor
of them within ten days after my decease or as
soon after as may be to well convey and dispose
off to ye High Court and his heirs and assigns for ever
all and every of my Lands, Tenements, Messuages, and Hereditaments
within this Province to be paid in full ye one half
the next 4th of April after my decease and ye other half ye 4th
anniversary then I give and bequeath all such Sum and
Summe of money as shall arise by sale of my lands
and Hereditaments as aforesaid and all and singular
my whole Personal Estate whatsoever and wheresoever
unto my Loving Wife Mary Jacques and my
Loving Son and Daughter John and Mary
Magdalen there Executors and administrators for
ever Equally

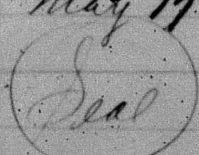

and authorities therunto belonging unto the said John
Lloyd for and during ever Pleasures and Subject to
such Conditions, Covenants, and Provisors, Payments
Orders and Instructions to be faithfully observed performed
and done by the said John Lloyd his Deputy or Deputies
or Servants as he shall from time to time receive
from his Majesty under his Royal Sign Manual or
from his Majesty's Lord High Treasurer or Commis-
sioner of the Treasury of Great Britain for the time being,
or from us the said Edward Carteret & Galfredus Wal-
pole Esq^r. His Majesty's Postmaster General or from the
Post Master General for the time being in Writing
subscribed by us or by Our Order excepted always
and reserved to his Majesty and his Successors all &
every the Duty Sum & Sums of money payable for
the postage or Carriage of any Letters or Packets
according to any act or acts of Parliament or
acts of Assembly or council past all or any of his
Majesties Plantations Colonies or Possessions on the
said Continent of America Relating therunto over
and above the necessary expenses for Manag-
ing the said Posts and We do hereby strictly
require all Officers and Other employed in or
about the Posts already settled in any part
of his Majesty's Dominions on the Continent
of America or in relation to the Revenue
arising thereby from time to time to
give

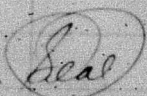
