That the same be disposed of as hereafter by this my last
 Will is Expressed. I give my Will and Desire is that all my just
 debts and funeral charges be paid and fully discharged by my
 Executors hereafter named & Item I give bequeath & devise to my
 well Beloved Wife Elizabeth Allen six negroes namely Bracke a
 negro man, Sature Webb and Rackill Women, Port and little Mary
 Garle together with one mare called Pullett and one horse that
 I bought of Coll^d. Parris and all the Cattle that was then in her
 Widowhood do her and her heirs forever, and farther my Will is
 that my Wife shall have the use of this House and Plantation
 to her own benefit during her natural life & Imp^t. I give
 bequeath and devise to my Eldest son Thomas Allen my
 Plantation ^{that is} called the Rice House Plantation
 with all that Tract of Land that belongs to it together with
 six Negroes. Namely Tony, James and Jo^s. Men; Patt and Subb
 Monson, & Jacob a Boy, and one half of all my stock Except that
 part I have given to my wife to be Equally and Imp^t
 equally divided betwixt my two sons when my Eldest son
 shall arrive to the age of Eighteen years old - Imp^t. I
 give bequeath & devise to my youngest son James Allen
 one Tract of Land containing One Hundred Acres, & the
 Land I bought of Sarah Lewis and a Tract of Land lying
 and being on a Place called Port Royal Island to the South-
 ward and this House and Plantation wherein I now live
 But to be and remain in the possession of my wife as afores^d.
 My Will is that Four Hundred Acres of Land that is
 at Port Royal shall be sold if my Executors think fitt, and
 with the money to purchase two Hundred Acres of Land of
 Joshua Wilde for my Son James, I likewise give and
 bequeath to my son James six Negroes namely Jorne and
 Lipea, Men, Anthony and Amos, Boys, Nanny & Judy Garle
 and

And the one half of all my stock except that part afore given
 and Bequeathed to my wife, to be Equally and Impartially
 divided when my Eldest son shall arrive to the age of
 Eighteen as aforesaid - Item - I give Bequeath & devise to
 my son Leonard White One negro girl named Marraun
 to him and his heirs forever Imp: I give Bequeath & devise
 to my Brother in Law Robert Clemens one Negro Girl
 named Betty to him and the Lawfull Begotten heirs of his
 Body; and if it shall please God, to take him out of the World
 without a Lawfull Heir as aforesaid Then and in such Case
 the above Bequest Legacy, shall return to my sons or some
 that shall be then alive or their heirs - Item I give a Negro
 man ^{named} Boson and a Negro Woman named Mary their Freedom
 at the Expiration of One Year after my Death, but in case
 the said Negro Woman Mary shall have any Child born
 during her life they shall be Slave to my sons Imp: My
 Will and desire is that my Executors, shall make use of
 what money I have in the House which is above Two
 hundred Pounds, and yett in what is due from M^r. William
 Gibson which is above Eighty pounds & all other that is
 due to me to discharge my debts & funeral charges
 and that they Immediately pay M^r. Quelch for the money
 or Better Security. Lastly I make, constitute Ordain
 and Appoint my Beloved Wife Elizabeth Allen, my
 Brother in Law Johannah Clemens and M^r. John White
 Executors of This my Last Will and Testament - In
 Witness whereof I have hereunto sett my hand and fixed
 my seal this Twentieth Second day of March In the Year
 of Our Lord 1721st.

 the power of granting the administration of all & singular
 the goods, rights, & credits of the said deceased, and also
 the auditing the Accts. Calculations & Reckonings of
 the said Administration and the final Decision and
 discharge from the same to me is manifestly known to
 Belong. And that the Administration of all & singular
 the Goods Rights & Credits of the said deceased & his

 that he hath been concerned in the said Business for the said
 M^r Rhett and his Father W^m Rhett since the said
 William Rhett's departure from South Carolina to England
 from the year 1718 aforesaid untill this present year 1722
 during which time he hath received severall small Con-
 =signments Ordered to be left with the said Edward Moseley
 by Joseph Palmer, Master of the Mary, schooner, viz^t in the
 Year 1720 & 1721 for which he was directed to take remittan-
 =ces in provisions as aforesaid. And the said Edward Moseley
 further saith that in the latter Part of the Year 1720 the said
 Edward Moseley having discourse with the said Joseph Palmer
 concerning the price of Tobacco in South Carolina, the said
 Edward Moseley did ship on Board the said Mary schooner
 Joseph ^{mentioned} ^{least Order} ^{Rhett} ^{for} ^{Directly or Indirectly} ^{Procurement} ^{of} ^{Tobacco} ^{about} ^{the} ^{William}
