 fitt. As for my worldly Estate Wherewith it hath
 pleased God to bless me with in this Life I
 give Ordain and dispose of the same in the
 following manner and form
 Imprimis I give and bequeath unto my children
 in Law John Betterson William Betterson and Mary
 Betterson one hundred Pounds Current money
 of the said Province to each of the said Bettersons.
 Item I give one hundred Pounds to be devised out
 of my Estate to the Free School of St. Johns
 Parish and no other use but for a help to
 raise a Free School in the said Parish

 three feather beds that is to each one a bed such as
 my Executors shall think fitt.
