belonging to the said ^{Agrekiak Emme} William Emms, which shall come to yo^r
hands, you are to render when you shall be thereunto required
by such Guardian or Guardians as shall be chosen by the
said William Emms and Agrekiak Emme, to the said
William Emms and Agrekiak Emme when they shall come
to full age to demand or receive the same by Law respective-
ly.
