South Carolina.

I know all men By These Presents that I
William Johnson late of Popsham in Great
Britain Salt Maker, am held and firmly
bound unto William Rhett Jun^r of the Province
of S^t. Carolina aforesaid Esq^r (Attorney to M^r. W.
Rhett Jun^r Merch^t) in the full & just sum of
One hundred & fifty pounds Sterling money of
England to be paid to the said William Rhett
his Executors, Administrators or assigne, the so^d
payment well and truly to be made I bind my
self my heirs Executors & Adminors firmly by these
presents. Sealed with my Seal and dated this
Thirtieth day of December 1721.

Whereas William Johnson
has drawn and date
in Great Britain
William Rhett Jun^r
(Attorney to M^r. W.
Rhett Jun^r Merch^t)
for the sum of
£ 75 Sterling
the so^d
sum of Seventy five
pounds Sterling
money of England.
Now the obli-
gation is such that if the
Executors Administrators or assigne
of the said William Johnson
shall and do well and truly
pay or cause to be paid
the said sum of Seventy five
pounds Sterling according
to the purport true intent
and meaning of the said
Bills of Exchange, then this
Obligation to be void or else
to remain in full force and
