In the Name of God Amen. I Sarah Daniell
of Berkeley County in the Province of South Ca-
rolina Widdow being weak in Body but of Sound &
perfect mind & memory Pray be given to Almighty
God for the same, do make and ordain this my last
Will & Testament in manner and form following
First I Bequeath my soul unto the hands of Almighty
God, Hoping and Believing the Salvation of the same
Through

On obligation to his said Brother Marmaduke Namell
 to do and perform the same, and shall also pay unto
 M^{rs} Mary Johnson that now lives with me, the Sum
 of Fifty Curr. money of this Province in Remains and
 I also give to the said Mary Johnson all my wearing
 apparel Linen & outside cloaths I also give devise
 and Bequeath to M^{rs} Elizabeth Daggett Sen^r the Sum
 of Fifty pounds Curr. money of this Province to be paid
 her within One Year after my Decease. And if my
 son Robert Namell shall build the said Front Wall
 and Pay & Recharge the said mentioned Legacies accord-
 ing to the true Intent & meaning of this my Will, then
 in Such Case & not otherwise, I do give devise and
 Bequeath to my said son Robert Namell his Executors
 Administrators and assigns all my ^{town} ^{and} Negroes & Cattle,
 all my cattle horses and Stock of all sorts with all the
 materials belonging to the Plantation & all my household
 goods & plate And I do also give to my son Robert
 Namell One Diamond Ring containing three large
 Stones, & Two ² Sparks One pair of Diamond Earrings
 One Stone in each and One Gold Seat which I leave
 in Possession of Sarah Rhett Jun^r. And shall not
 be delivered to him untill he ^(marries) ~~be married~~ but in Case he
 should never marry then I give the above mentioned
 Diamond Ring, Earrings & Gold Seat to my Son
 Marmaduke Namell and in case they should both
 be unmarried, then I give, devise & bequeath the above
 = mentioned

 a Person of good Credit and Reputation and to me well
 known who on his oath on the Holy Evangelists taken saith
 That in the beginning of the Year 1718 he had a consignment
 of a small vessel called the coasting galley and her Cargo
 from M^r W^m Rhett Jun^r of South Carolina Merchant, for
 which he was instructed to make remittances in provisions
 of Corn, Pork, Beef & Tallow for the use of his Family
 that he hath been concerned in the said Business for the said
 M^r Rhett and his Father W^m Rhett since the said
 William Rhett's departure from South Carolina to England
 from the year 1718 aforesaid untill this present year 1722
 during which time he hath received severall small Con-
 = signments Ordered to be left with the said Edward Moseley
 by Joseph Palmer, Master of the Mary, schooner, viz^t in the
 Year 1720 & 1721 for which he was directed to take remittan-
 = ces in provisions as aforesaid. And the said Edward Moseley
 further saith that in the latter Part of the Year 1720 the said
 Edward Moseley having discourse with the said Joseph Palmer
 concerning the price of Tobacco in South Carolina, the said
 Edward Moseley did ship on Board the said Mary schooner
 Joseph Palmer Master fifteen hundred weight of Tobacco
 receipt hereto
