Item I pray my aforesaid Son and Administrators to
Divide Equally the Rents or profits of the
aforesaid Plantations, or Estate between my Son
Theodore Verdy and my Daughter Mary after
that the aforesaid Six hundred Pounds shall be
paid unto my Wife Eli^z and Eight hundred Pounds
to my Daughter Mary

Item I give and bequeath unto each of my Executors
and Administrators a gold Ring and a Riding -
Horse, and to my Brother Peter Parker a Gun
and my Pistol and a gold Ring, and to my Sister
Marion and Susan each of them a gold Ring

Item I give and bequeath unto my Godson Isaac
Parker son to my Brother Isaac Parker
a Couple of my best ~~riding~~ Breeding
Mares In Witness whereof I have hereunto
set mine hand and Seal this Twenty day of

Matthew in Brigard was J^{es} P^{er}son at the same time and did
sign his Name as a witness and that the said Testator was
of sound and disposing mind and memory at the same
time

In the Name of God Amen I Florence Pirancy of
Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina being
Sick and weak in Body but of sound and Perfect
mind and Memory, do make and Ordain this my
last will and Testament in manner as follows
First I give and bequeath my soul to God my Body to
the Earth to be buried in Decent manner as my
Friends shall think fitt

Secondly I give and bequeath and my will is that my
Widow at St. Georges Belonging to me should in
Pencilvania in New Castle County, to be Divided
between my true and Loving wife Anne Pirancy, and
my beloved Son Sam^l Pirancy (My paying Mr. Rich^d
Rich Twenty Two pounds Pencilvania Money)
during the natural life of my said Wife, and after her
Decease to my eldest Son Sam^l Pirancy and his heirs
for ever

(38) I do Nominate and Appoint my Trusty Friends
Mr. William Pitt, Cap. Laurence Dumas and Mr.
John Hopper, to be my Executors of this my last will
and Testament. Revoking all former Wills and Testam^{ts}
and this only I acknowledge to be my last will &

(who gave it) and hoping for his Pardon of all my
Sins, in and through the Merits and for the sake of
his only Son, Jesus Christ my Redeemer and my
Proxy to the Earth to be Buried the said as to my
Estate hereafter named Math. I have next & before
as for my Temporal Estate, which do hath pleased
God to bestow upon me, I do hereby bequeath and
give order and Dispose of the same in following
(that is to say)

My debts I will that all manner of Debts which of
right or in conscience I justly owe to any Person
or Persons whatsoever be well and truly paid within
reasonable time after my Death by any
Execut^r hereafter named

I do give and bequeath unto my Brother Eagle
Hermanion son of Camer also to my Brother Benjamin
Wybrausen, and likewise to my Sister Wybrausen
unto each and every of them, whatever moiety or
hereafter at the time of my Death becomes
due to me, from any Person or Persons who live
in Europe and the same to be divided & appointed
for & among my two said Brothers and Sister
according to the Customs of North Holland

I do give & bequeath unto my said Brother Eagle
Hermanion my Dwelling House, all my Books, Papers
and
