In the Name of God Amen the thirteenth day of
 September in the Year of our Lord one thousand &
 seven hundred and eighty eight I James Reid
 of Newbury Town on the Western Branch of Cooper
 River in the Parish of St. Johns in the County of
 Beaufort Georgia being being in sound mind and
 good Health in Body and Perfect Memory thank
 be given to God, therefore calling unto mind the
 mortality of his Body, and knowing that it is
 appointed for all men to dye do make and Ordain this
 my Last Will and Testament, in manner and form following
 that is to say first and Principally, I give my Soul into
 the hands of Almighty God who gave it to me, and my
 Body I commend to the earth to be buried in a Christian
 and Decent manner in the burial place said and
 before nothing doubting that at the general resurrection
 I shall receive the same again by the mighty Power
 of God, and as touching such Words by Estate, whereby

God hath been pleased to bless me in this Life, I give &
 devise bequeath all that Square of Land upon Newbury
 -bury of the Ferry of the containing five Acres Square
 to the said Robert Munn and Robert Bowden and a half of Land sitting on the River
 Bay and also the Marsh two Acres and a half between
 the Bay & the River as it appears in the Town Plot to
 my Trustees hereafter named in trust to them and their
 Executors for ever to be let out by them for a College
 or University, when any Laws and Government shall
 or People shall be feeling for that use and just to no
 other use any penalty of one hundred pounds of Sterling
 English money to the Owners of said Newbury Town & they
 for Isaac Reid and his Heirs to enjoy and to have &
 to hold the profits of the aforesaid Gift until it be
 bequeathed to my son Isaac Reid, two Lots of Land
 to the Ferry of the containing half an acre each Lot
 four Chains long and one Chain wide each Lot over for the
 bridge which is one acre, sitting in the River Bay
 together with the River Marsh between the Bay and the
 River. Then I give and bequeath one acre and a
 half of Land for to build a Church or Chapel upon it &
 for a Burying Place for the Inhabitants of Newbury
 Town and all in the Western and Eastern Branch of
 Cooper River as it is bounded out to the Local Town and
 a Cider press but the Timber Trees growing or may
 hereafter grow in the Church Yard and all the harbours
 & vines & pastures I give to my son Isaac Reid and his
 Heirs for ever to a priorior & upon condition that they
 the Church Yard weeded & cleaned & smooth from hogs
 digging upon penalty of Ten shillings all the Timber &
 Trees Lucrative & great to my Trustees and them to
 dispose of it to whom they shall think fitting, Then I
 give & bequeath nine Chains of Land a Square in the
 middle of the Town as it appears in the Town Plot
 for a market place I then give and bequeath one Lot

and the Inverness of him power to build a free school
upon it to a house for the schoolmaster, and my
Trustee to put in a licensed schoolmaster to keep a
