 the South side adjoining to it to him and his heirs
 his Body and after his death to his heirs and assigns
 them and their heirs for ever and always to be held
 with his Brother John and sister Elizabeth all my
 Personal Estate and to the Widow and one of his small
 Lots and in the Town plat to him and his heirs
 forever —

(6) ^{My dear} I am well here alone and not here in prison as
told if Oration be, and his people there after
you wife has taken her share be said not for
the edification of my children and church so the
truth shows accordingly told if need full —

(77) I have now voluntarily sold if need falls —
 to my will that my two sons Saml: and John
 be brought up at the College in New England to
 good learning and then charge them of some
 part of my Estate there and that my Brother Will:
 should have the care of them here, and that
 he follow all such order concerning them &
 my Interest there as I shall give him —

(8) I give and bequeath about thirty acres of
land, lying on the North side of the Broad
part of Longland I bought of Joseph Sumner
for the use of this chapel for ever

9/ I give and bequeath unto Joseph Ford Jun.
all the horses that are branded to the different
bands for use for that purpose upon
condition that he do send to the Judge
brought up to good learning to him and
his heirs for ever

(10) And lastly I wish you to take Mr. Ho—
Tearing to be my Regulator of his my
last will and Testament and after my Son

Son Sam. comes to the age of twenty one
 years and Receivd his Estate to be regned by him
 & said to in the presence John Thomas Esq
 the words of his Body
 I interlined Decr 24. 1717
