

45 I give and bequeath to my son Joseph one hundred
 acres of land on the North side of the swamp, bounded
 of the Waring and two hundred acres of land on
 in the swamp adjoining to it to him and his heirs
 his Body, his wife, his children, his heirs, and to
 them and their heirs for ever and ever, and
 with his Brother John and sister Elizabeth, all my
 Personal Estate and to the Widow and said Thomas
 Lott and in the Town of Lott to him and his heirs
 for ever

(6) It is my will that my son Joseph and his wife
 should if occasion be, and his wife should if
 her wife has taken her share, he said not for
 the education of my Children and Children, the
 said Thomas should if needful

(7) It is my will that my son John and sister
 Elizabeth should be brought up at the College in New England to
 good Learning and the charges thereof to be borne
 out of my Estate there and that my Brother Thomas
 should have the care of them there, and that
 he should also, in order concerning them to
 my Interest there as I shall give him

(8) I give and bequeath about thirty acres of
 land, lying on the North side of the Broad
 part of the swamp I bought of Joseph Sumner
 for the use of the church for ever

(9) I give and bequeath unto my son John and
 sister Elizabeth that are bound to a different
 bound from mine for that purpose upon my
 condition, that he be sent to the College
 brought up to good Learning to him and
 his heirs for ever

(10) And lastly I make and constitute the
 Waring to be my Executor of this my
 last will and Testament, and after my son

son John comes to the age of twenty one
 years and he shall his Estate to be enjoyed to him
 signed sealed & in the presence John Moore Esq
 of the words of his Body
 first underlined / Decr 24. 1717

 as a witness in writing only whereof I have subscribed also
 my name the day and year above written J. Moore

(8) I desire that to have full and free pardon & forgiveness of all my sins, and to Inherit the everlasting life of my Body I commit to the earth to be decently Buried at the Discretion of my Executors hereafter named and as touching the Disposition of all such Temporal Estate as doth shall & straightly I do to be two upon me I give and dispose thereof as follows

Item I give and bequeath unto my Loving Wife Judith Penney my Negro Boy Jack of Name along with all his Land & House furniture and one Bed being in hand I give & bequeath all to my Mary & Patsy & whatever belong to me all and any of kindred being not naming her as being in John Beaumont & Mr. Randolph Esqrs to see that they may not be Wronged out any thing involving them as Executors, hoping that will do for the best of this world. I do desire if it be a boy he may have the House and Land and other things to be equally divided between them if it be a boy or girl

Partridge to be my personal Executors of this my last will & Testament in testimony whereof I have hereunto set my hand & Seal the Day & Year first above written
