 Writing to be, stand as and for her Last will and
 Testament: and did see her to be in sound Mind and perfect
 Sign her Name as Witness, and that the said Testator
 was of sound and disposing Mind & Memory at the same

 I, Theodore Fordet, of Berkeley County in the
 Province of South Carolina Planting being
 well in body, full of good perfect memory
 thanks be to Him who is God, and calling to
 remembrance the Uncertainty of Transitory
 Life and that all Flesh must yield unto Death
 when God shall please to call, I do make my Testament
 and Declare this my last will and
 Testament in manner and Form following
 Revoking and annulling by this all and
 every Testament and Testament Wills and Acts
 heretofore by me made and Declared like by
 Word or Writing. And this will is to be taken
 for my Last will and Testament: First and
 Principally from the Bottom of mine Heart
 for all mine sins most humbly begging
 forgiveness through the mercy of Jesus Christ
 my only Redeemer for his sake
 I do bequeath my precious Soul unto
 almighty God my Creator Saviour and
 Redeemer, and my Body to be buried, as my
 Executors

Executors shall think fit
 Item I Desire that all my Duties may all justly and truly be
 paid to the convenient Time after my Death
 Here and for the Settling my Temporal Estate and
 such good, I called for the hath pleased God, face
 above my Desires to bestow on me I Desire and
 Desire for my Executors and Administrators
 Nathaniel Broughton Thomas Waring, Isaac
 Pocher Junr. and my Dear Beloved Wife Eli
 Fordet, whilst the shall continue a Widow
 Here I give and bequeath unto my Dear Beloved Son
 Theodore Fordet my off Plantation called by the
 Name of Black Berry, Containing Twelve Hundred
 Acres of Land or thereabouts in 3 plots, Never to be
 sold, but to goe and be for the next heir male of this
 Body of my Son Theodor: and if no male to the female
 and if my Son should dye before I then the
 aforesaid Plantation to goe and be for my
 Daughter Mary and so to the next Heir male of
 her body or female if no male, and if my said
 Daughter should dye without any Issue after
 Body then the said Plantation to goe and be for my
 Wife Eli: or the next Heir: I do desire that my
 Wife Eli: that she may live on and manage the
 aforesaid plantation with the remaining a
 Widow, till my Son Theodore be of Age: But
 after of my aforesaid Wife Eli: Remains then
 I desire my Executors and Administrators Nathaniel
 Broughton Thomas Waring and Isaac Pocher
 Junr. to have the sole care and management of my
 Estate and pay in a convenient time to my Wife
 Elizabeth out of the Plantation's Revenue, or
 Rodew, the sum of six hundred Pounds Curr
 Money of this Province
 Item I give and bequeath unto my Daughter Mary
 a Plantation Containing five Hundred and thirty
 Acres of Land called by the Name of Whitall and

thousand Pounds. I give Manors of this Province
which I pray my aforesaid Son and Administrators
to pay her whole of Age or Marriage out of the
Rents of the same, and after that all the
whole Estate that shall be found in Negroes -
Indians, Muskies or any other Slave, Two girls
excepted, one named Beth for my wife Eli^z and one
Lance for my Daughter Mary. All the Negro girls
of the rest of my whole Estate y^e shall remain
shall be and remain for my dear beloved Son
Theodore Verdy when of Age. I give also an acre
and a half to my Wife Eli^z and an acre and a
half to my Daughter Mary out of my Breeds
of land may be found

Item I pray my aforesaid Son and Administrators to
Divide Equally the revenues or produce of the
aforesaid Plantations, or Estate between my Son
Theodore Verdy and my Daughter Mary after
that the aforesaid Six hundred Pounds shall be
paid unto my Wife Eli^z and Eight hundred Pounds
to my Daughter Mary

Item I give and bequeath unto each of my Executors
and Administrators a gold Ring and a Riding -
Horse, and to my Brother Peter Parker a Gun
and my Pistol and a gold Ring, and to my Sister
Marion and Susan each of them a gold Ring

Item I give and bequeath unto my Godson Isaac
Parker son to my Brother Isaac Parker
a Couple of my best ~~riding~~ Breeding
Mares in Wales where of I have hereunto
set mine hand and Seal this Twenty day of
May Anno 1720

sign his Name as a witness and that the said Testator was
of sound and disposing mind and memory at the time

In the Name of God Amen I Florence Pirancy of
Charles Town in the Province of South Carolina being
Sick and weak in Body but of sound and Perfect
mind and Memory do make and Ordain this my
last will and Testament in manner as follows
First I give and bequeath my soul to God my Body to
the Earth to be buried in Decent manner as my
Friends shall think fitt

Secondly I give and bequeath and my will is that my
Widow s^r George Belonging to me and in
Pencilvania in New Castle County to be Divided
between my true and Loving wife Ann Pirancy and
my beloved Son Sam^l Pirancy (My paying Mr. Rich^d
Rich Twenty Two pounds Pencilvania Money)
during the natural life of my said Wife, and after
her decease to my eldest Son Sam^l Pirancy and his heirs
for ever
