South Carolina In the Name of God Amen, Abraham Eve Esq. of the Parish of St. Paul in Colleton County in the Province of South Carolina being sick and weak in body, but by the mercy of Almighty God of sound mind and memory do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament in manner and form following, that is to say, That I principally bequeath my soul into the hands of Almighty God my most merciful Creator hoping thro' the alone merits and satisfaction of his Son Jesus Christ our Lord, God blessed for ever more, to obtain the free pardon & remission of all my sins. my body to return to the Earth from whence it was taken to be decently, and in a Christian like manner buried at the discretion of my Executors herein after named. And as for the worldly goods wherewith it hath pleased Almighty God to bless me, I will, give and bequeath as followeth.
Impr: I will, give & bequeath unto my dearly beloved Wife Hannah Eve, one Indian Girl called Nanny, and all my Plantation or Plantations lying and being on the South side of Torwoodo Creek, together with the Dutch house, and all appurtenances of what nature or kind sever unto the said Plantation or Plantations any manner of way appertaining or belonging, To have & to hold the said Plantation or Plantations to her the said Hannah Eve.

Beloved Wife, and to her heirs and Assigns for ever.

Item, I will, give and bequeath unto the said Hannah my beloved Wife one full half of all my other Real and Personal Estate of what nature or kind soever to have, hold, use, occupy and enjoy the same for and during the term of her natural Life only.

Item I will, give and bequeath the remaining half of my said other Estate of what nature or kind soever in manner following. That is to say, one full half of the clear profits of my whole Estate Real and Personal (excepting what is already given & bequeathed to my dearly beloved Wife Hannah Eve to her heirs for ever) after all reasonable charges thereof are deducted and paid for the sole use, benefit and behoof of the right heir male of the body of my Brother John Eve late of Sateham near Uxbridge in the County of Middlesex in the Kingdom of Great Britain, if any such Heir Male shall be living at the time of my decease, to be remitted to him yearly and every Year by my Executors herein after named. But in case no such Heir Male of the body of my said Brother, John Eve shall be alive and remaining at my decease, then and in that case only I will, give and bequeath the same in like manner unto my Nephew Abraham the son of my dear Sister Elizabeth Dore by her first Husband.

Item I will, give and bequeath all my real & personal Estate whatsoever after the demise of the abovesaid Hannah my beloved Wife excepting what is hereby before given and bequeathed to her her heirs and Assigns for ever, unto the said right Heir Male of the body of my said Brother, John Eve, if there be any such, to have and to hold the same to him and his heirs for ever. But if there be no such Heir Male of the body of my said Brother, John Eve remaining, then and in that case only I will, give and bequeath, all the said Real and Personal Estate, except before excepted unto my abovesaid Nephew Abraham the son of my abovesaid Sister Elizabeth Dore, by her first Husband to have and to hold the same to him & his heirs for ever.

Lastly, I make, constitute and appoint my dearly beloved Wife Hannah Eve and my beloved friends Capt. Christopher Wilkinson & Mr. Joseph Moody Joint Executors of this my last Will and Testament revoking and making void hereby all former Will or Wills by me heretofore made if any such shall be found declaring this to be my last Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my hand and seal this Twenty second day of March in the Year of our Lord 1722/3.
