Maj. Genl. Paul's (2nd) S. Carolina

In the Name of God Amen, I pray...
that my last Will and Testament may stand, and may be made
valid, I give unto my dearly beloved Wife, my dear Loving
of all my house hold & her life, and one third of all my personal
Estate, to her and her heirs forever.

Now I give unto my son Lewis, George the son of Lewis, the son of his Grand
Father, Henry, with the land belonging to the said Lewis, in and
about Charles Towne, to wit: one hundred Acres of Land in Newmarket
Neck in Virginia River being part of Malabar Parish, and four hundred
Acres of Land and Water, twang to the river line on. And the one fourth
of all my Estate, as Houses, houses, furniture, household goods, &c. to him to his heirs
forever. From I give unto my son Edward Parley my house to stand on the front
of Charles Towne, & the front of Lewis Thomas Smith & Capt. George Smith,
to one thousand Acres of Land called Newmarket, one quarter of an acre
of Land upon to five hundred Acres of Free Land adjoining on the one side, my
Mr. Parley had one fifth of all my Estate to him to his heirs forever.

Then I give unto my son Anthony, Twenty five English acres of the Land which was John Blifford's in Charles Town, Three hundred Acres called York Land, & two hundred Acres Land called York Land in Macclesfield, in Maryland. And five hundred acres of fine Land, lying in Western County, in John Cragg's Land, & one fifth of all my Lands, to be have to his he heirs for ever.

Then I gave unto my Daughters Ten Acres by Two hundred Acres of Land call'd
Sawdust to Two hundred Acres of Land call'd Three hundred and one hundred or
Lake's River in Maryland and Twenty two Acres of Land between Myself &
Dad's Tamar called by one fifth of all my Estate by to her and her heirs
for ever. Then I gave unto my Daughter

My memory is that my wife had the use of her hands during her life to the time of her personal estate, & so with what she pleased, in the manner of mutual estate, gave to my wife & children to be equally divided amongst them by equal shares & portions. That part that he gave to the survivors.
