I give my Slaves with all my Chattell, Rings, & Hogs plantation tools, canoes come with the remainder part of my house and Goods to my four daughters aforesaid to each of them a fourth part. Item I make and Ordain my two Sons in Law for my Executors my Son Paul Hammelton and my Son John some of this my last Will & Testament. And I do utterly revoke all former wills and Testaments by me in any wise Heretofore made or declared.
