To All To Whom these Presents shall come Greeting.

Know Ye, That Whereas John Ever Taylor (as is said) is lately deceased. After whose death administration of all and singular the goods, rights and credits of the said dec. was committed and granted to Peter Taylor as next of kin to the said deceased. But Whereas afterwards (to wit) on the seventeenth day of June in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Twenty one at Charles Town, now Charles City and Port in this Province aforesaid, the last Will and Testament of the said John Ever Taylor dec. was before me exhibited, proved, approved and allowed of, and Letters Testamentary were thereupon granted on the twenty sixth day of April in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Twenty Two, unto Samuel Probst, as being the only Executor (then present in this Province) named in the said Will and Testament, Which said Samuel Probst since died, leaving behind him some goods, rights and Credits of the said John Ever Taylor dec. within the Province aforesaid, unadministered.
