 constitute and appoint this my Last Will and Testament in manner
 and form following, that is to say, first and principally I recommend my
 Soul to God hoping through the Merits of my Saviour Jesus Christ to
 Inherit Eternal Life my Body to be decently Buried at the discretion of
 my Executor hereafter named and as to my worldly Estate wherewith it
 shall please God to bless me I dispose of it in manner as follows
 Impurimus

Impurimus I give and bequeath unto my Loving Brother Joseph
 Maybank a Negro Wench named Scatim and also a Mare Colt to him and
 his heirs forever, that is to say when to the said Joseph Maybank shall arrive
 at the Age of Eighteen Years till which time my will and pleasure is that
 they remain in the possession of my Executor hereafter named. Item I give
 unto my most Dear Sister Susannah Bond a Negro Man named Basket and a
 Negro Woman named Rachel as also a Mare named Pitt and the Third
 Part of the household Goods left by my deceased husband Thomas Allen as also
 all my Fowling to her and to her heirs forever. Item I give unto my Loving
 Nephew George Taddon Bond a Negro Wench named Peck to him and to
 his heirs forever. Item I give unto my Loving Niece Elizabeth Bond
 a Negro Woman named Bess and a Negro Girl named Little Mary with
 all my trinkets to her and to her heirs forever. Item I give unto my Son
 in Law James Allen a Negro Child the Son of the Negro Wench named Deb
 and also an Iron pot which I will give unto him at what time he please and
 enjoys the Estate given him by his deceased Father Thomas Allen and I also
 give him two mourning Rings and another piece at the time aforesaid.
 Item I give unto my Son Thomas Allen the Mourning Ring which was his
 Mother's and to both my Sons in Law aforesaid I give my third part of the
 plantation land provided they allow my Brother Jacob Bond the whipsaw
 Bought of Mr. Colvagh. Lastly I give unto my Loving Brother Jacob
 Bond my horse named Diamond and my Truff box and best ring together
 with my share of the Crop made on the Rice house plantation and at home
 as also all my debts Bonds notes Mortgages and what else is appertaining
 to me either in my Own Right or by my deceased husband Thomas Allen's
 Right and I do hereby appoint him the said Jacob Bond his Executor of
 this my Last Will and Testament hereby revoking and annulling all former
