James Tanyarn Will (vide Bunde) G. N. 17

In the Name of God Amen, I James Tanyarn

of Berkeley County in the Province aforesaid being sick and weak in Body but of sound and disposing mind and memory and being uncertain how long it shall please God that I may be continued, I am willing and desirous to settle my affairs in manner & form following:

I Recommend my soul into the hands of almighty God through the Merits of Jesus Christ our Lord, and I desire my Body may be decently buried as my Executors hereafter named shall think fit. I do hereby make and appoint that all my just debts fully paid and satisfied as far as possibly may be, and that the Profits of my Estate be applied towards a school that the English, French and other kinds of Pistols and other Hatch, be all sold, and the Proceeds or monies arising there

Therefrom applied to the Payment of my Debts. I give Give Devise and Assign all unto my Son, Benjamin, one full moiety or half part of all my Negroes and other things together with all my House, Money, Cattle, Next Estate, and all other books whatsoever as also all my Household Furniture of any kind at which to be and remain to be used by the said Benjamin. And I do also give unto my said Son all that Five Hundred and Ten Acres of Land lying on the north side of the River of the South, which I bought from my uncle John Fitch, during the Term of his natural Life, and after his Death to be and remain as part of the Plantation I now live on. And I do further give unto my said Son, Wife and his heirs forever all that Lot of Land which I have in Charles Town, and around it according to the Grants thereof.

I Give and Bequeath unto my Dear Son Benjamin Tanyarn, and to his Heirs forever all that Plantation I now live on, with the Buildings thereon and the One moiety or full half part of all my Negroes and other things, to be put to use of the said Benjamin, his heirs, Executors, and assigns, One year. But in case my said Son shall depart this Life before he shall attain to the Age of twenty one year, and nothing shall be done therein to the said Benjamin, then it is my Will and Desire, That my said Plantation be and remain to my Brother Thomas Tanyarn, and that the moiety or half part of my Negroes and other things given my said Benjamin, be equally divided among the Children of my Brother Thomas, and if my Brother Thomas shall also die before he arrives to the Age of twenty one year, then and in such case, it is my Will and Desire, That the Plantation I now live on shall be and remain to my Nephew John Woodward, Son of Esq. John Woodward and Elizabeth his Wife, to him and his Heirs forever.

It is my Will and Desire, That my dear beloved Wife, shall be at full liberty to live on my Plantation during the Term of years, whether or whether which ever of them the said Plantation shall happen to die to and that she shall enjoy the Profits thereof during that time, my said Wife being first paid, or as much as my Estate shall think proper to allow for the maintenance and Education of my Son, and it is my Will that none of my Negroes be moved off my Plantation, but continue working there until all my Debts are fully paid and satisfied. And whereas I am father to my Brother Thomas Tanyarn, I do desire all due care may be taken of my said Son, to have the same fully discharged as soon as possible. But if my said Son shall die before he shall attain to the Age of twenty one year, and nothing shall be done therein to the said Benjamin, then it is my Will and Desire, That the said Plantation be and remain to my Nephew John Woodward, Son of Esq. John Woodward and Elizabeth his Wife, to him and his Heirs forever.

I do hereby make and appoint that all my just debts fully paid and satisfied as far as possibly may be, and that the Profits of my Estate be applied towards a school that the English, French and other kinds of Pistols and other Hatch, be all sold, and the Proceeds or monies arising therefrom applied to the Payment of my Debts.
