One thousand Seven hundred and Twenty Three, I John Lawrence of
Christ Church Parish of the said Province being very sick and weak in body but
of perfect mind and memory Thanks be to God the giving unto him
the mortality of our frail body, and that it is appointed for all Men once to
die, I do make and ordain this my last Will and Testament, it is to say
primarily first of all I give and recommend my Soul to God that gave it and my
body I recommend to the earth to be buried in decent manner at the discretion of
my Executors after my debts and funeral expences are paid and discharged I dispose
of and bequeath my worldly Estate as followeth, vizt.
I give unto my son John Lawrence one hundred Acres of
Land, I bequeath to him and one Negro Man named Cuffy.
I give unto my son John Lawrence one hundred Acres of Land
a parcel unto my son John's Land and two Negroes namely James and
Moses. I give unto my Daughter Sarah White one Boy named Prince
and one Horse named Talapoy.
I give unto my loving Wife Catherine Lawrence two Negroes, a
man named Billy and a Girl named Bess. Likewise if all my debts shall
shall be equally divided between my said Wife and my son John and
John and my whole parcel of household goods to be wholly for my Wife.
It is my true intent and meaning if my said Wife during her natural
life shall have hold every occupy on all my Land or Plantations with-
out any molestation by any to whom it is bequeath but if in case she
should die her children by Marriage before my said son shall arrive
to the age of one and twenty years that then and such case she shall
devest the said reason and provide and my son to enjoy what to
them is bequeath at the said age of one and twenty years.
I nominate constitute ordain and appoint to be Executors to this my
last Will and Testament my well beloved Wife and son in Law John
White by their persons or their deputies, executors, agents and make void all
other Wills and Testaments formerly by me by me made and or ratify
