of Berkeley County in the Province aforesaid being sick and maimed & in Pain but of sound and disposing mind and memory and being uncertain how long I shall please God that I may be enabled I am willing and desirous to settle my affairs in manner & form following:

Imp^r I Recommend my self into the hands of almighty God through the
Merits of Jesus Christ our Lord, And desire my Body may be decently
buried as my Executors hereafter named shall think fit.
Item I do order and appoint that all my just debts by fully paid and
satisfied as far as possibly they can, and that the Profit of my Estate
be applied thereto, as also that the Children, Remains and all Aids of
Law which I have to the Inheritance my Wife my Sons, Daughters
Wife, and Eldest Child, be all sold, and the Proceeds or money arising

Therefrom applied to the Payment of my Wife's
 Joint of her Decedent's Personal and my Family Expenses that I am
 now making full and complete payment of all my Wages and other things
 together with all my house & other debts. And as other debts
 whatever as well as my Decedent's Furniture of any kind at which I be-
 lieve I am now the sole and true owner. And I do so give unto myself
 With all that Five Hundred and Ten Acres of Land adjoining on and which I
 bought from my uncle for \$1000 during the Lifetime of his natural
 life and after her Death to be and remain as part of the plantation I
 now live on. And I do further give unto my said Dear Wife and he have
 forever use that lot of land which I have in Charles Town (Virginia) and Mount
 Vernon and to the Grants thereof.

Now I have and signeth unto my Dear Son Benjamin, Benjamin
and his heirs forever all that Plantation I now live on with the
Building thereon and the One moiety or full half part of all my Negroes
and other things, to be present here of which he shall attain the Age of
Twenty One years. And in case my said Son shall depart this life
before he shall attain to the said Age and without Issue lawfully begotten
Then it is my Will and Desire that my said Plantation be and remain to
my Brother Thomas Stanger, and that the moiety or half part of my Negroes
and other things given my Son be equally divided among the Children of my
Three sisters. And if my Brother Thomas shall die before he arrives to the
Age of Twenty One years, then and in such case it is my Will and Desire
that the Plantation from Location shall be and remain to my Nephew John
Woodward, Son of Capt. John Woodward and Elizabeth his Wife to him and
his heirs forever.

It is my Will and Desire, That my dear beloved Wife, shall be at
full liberty to leave on my Plantation during the Meronies of my son Brother
or of a few which out of them the said Plantation shall happen to fall to me
that she may & enjoy the Profits thereof during that time my just and doing
just paid) excepting so much as my Executors shall think proper to allow for
the maintenance and Education of my son, And it is my Will that none of my
Slaves be more of my Plantation, but continue working there until all my
Debts are fully paid and satisfied. And when as you should to my
Brother Thomas, Mary Anne, I do give all due care may be taken by my
Estate to have the same justly discharged as soon as possible. But if my child
Brother shall offer to sue for the same before it can be paid off of my Plantation,
then and in such case I do hereby entirely release him off from having any Right
or Title to any of the Negroes in this my Will mentioned and contained any
thing herein to the contrary notwithstanding.

And hereby I certify and assign my son Francis Macomber these
William Cabot, John Willson and John Coffey to be Executors of this my
last Will and Testament. Forthwith signing all former and other Wills made
by me heretofore made and do hereby and declare this to be my last
Will and Testament. In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my
hand and seal my date the Twenty first day of March in the year
of our Lord One Thousand Seven Hundred and Ninety.
