In the Name of God Amen, I John Whitmarsh of Colleton County in the Province of South Carolina Planter, being sick and weak in body, but of sound and disposing mind and memory, Thanks be to God for it. Do make, ordain, publish and declare this my last Will and Testament, and first and principally I commend my Soul into the hands of God who gave it, a joyful trusting in the merits, Death and Resurrection of my Saviour Jesus Christ for full and free remission of all my sins, and to be made a partaker of a joyful resurrection. My Body I commit to the earth to be decently buried at the discretion of my Executors, hereafter named, and for my worldly estate with which it hath pleased God to bless me, I give and dispose of the same in manner following.

Impressis Trill that my debts which I owe in right or conscience be paid and satisfied out of my Estate.

Item, I give, Devise and bequeath One Thousand Pounds current money of this Province, to be paid by my Executors hereafter named, within One Year after my Death immediately ensuing, to the Parish of Saint Pauls in Colleton County in the province aforesaid, to be disposed of by the Minister, Vestry and Church-Wardens of the said Parish for the time being, for pious and Charitable uses in manner and form following That is to say, Five Hundred pounds of the said Thousand Pounds to be remitted to the Honourable Society for propagating the Gospel in foreign parts to be by them laid out in Books of Piety and Devotion, and sent to the said Minister, Vestry and Church-Wardens, to be distributed by them Gratis to the poor of y^e said Parish. The remaining Five hundred Pounds of the said Thousand Pounds to be employed towards the educating of the poor Children of the said Parish by the Minister Vestry and Church-Wardens aforesaid for the time being.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving friend and Cousin John Williamson, One Thousand Pounds of the like current money as aforesaid.

Item I give and bequeath unto my loving Wife Margaret Whitmarsh and to heirs for ever all and whatsoever shall be and remain, whether of my real or personal Estate after the discharge and payment of the debts and legacies aforesaid.

And furthermore my Will is that in order to the payment of the debts and legacies aforesaid my Executors hereafter to be named or their Executors or Survivors of them shall be and are hereby impowered to sell all such Lands, Tenements and Hereditaments as well the Egon next upon the ground as Negroes and other goods and chattels to me belonging or any may appertaining, except such Bonds or Negroes as by former Contract are made over to my said Wife at her signature, much I hereby canthin.

And lastly I make, ordain and appoint my said loving Wife Executrix, and Col^l. John Fairchild and John Williamson aforesaid Executors of this my last Will and Testament hereby revoking all former and other Wills by me heretofore made.

In Witness whereof I the said John Whitmarsh have hereunto set my hand and Seal this Thirtieth day of April Anno Dom. One Thousand Seven hundred and Twenty three. In W. Whitmarsh.
