I Ralph Inard of Berkeley County in the Province of South Carolina Gentleman, being at present in perfect health of Body and Mind and memory (Almighty God be praised) considering the certainty of Death, and the uncertainty of the time and hour thereof. To the end I may be always ready when it shall please God to call me, and that in the time of my sickness I may not be perplexed with the things of this world, when I should rationally mind better things, Tending to life Eternal. Do therefore in the time of my perfect health make and declare this my last Will and Testament in manner & forme following.

Imp^r. I give and bequeath unto my Son Ralph Inard his heirs & Assigns forever all that my tract of Land situate, lying and being on or near the South Side of Goose Creek in the County of Berkeley, containing 581 acres more or less. That is to say: 131 acres of Land, being or much reserved out of the Tract of Land sold to W^m Jacob Allen, And 250 Acres upon which I now dwell, having purchased it Rent free from Cap^t Gignidial (it being part of a 1000 Acres given to him by the said Proprietors rent free) And 200 Acres of Pine Land adjoining to the 250 Acres on which I now dwell with all the Houses, barns, Edifices, Gardens, Orchards, Lands, Wood, underwoods, Commons, Meadows with the appurtenances, unto any of the above named Tract or Tracts of Land belonging or in any way appertaining.
 Item: I give and bequeath unto my Son Ralph Inard his heirs and Assigns forever One Thousand Acres of Land that I bought of Doctor Forchire (it being part of a Tract run out by him and W^m Bibeau, Forchire purchased the Rent from the Proprietors) as also one other Tract of Land containing thirteen hundred Acres more or less lying upon a place called my Ladys Swamp, and adjoining upon a parcel of Land belonging to Mr. Moses May, with all the Woods, underwoods with the appurtenances therunto belonging or in any wise appertaining, unto the two above named Tracts of Land.
