To All, To Whom these Presents shall come, Greeting
Know Ye that on the Twenty fourth day of August in
the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and Twenty Two
before the honorable John Barnwell Esq^r. the last Will and Testament
of Patrick Martin, late a Soldier belonging to His Majesty's independent
Company of Soldiers at Fort King George in the Province aforesaid,
the copy whereof is to these presents annexed, was proved, pursuant to a
Vincennes Probate Court bearing date the twenty sixth day of July Anno
Domⁱ 1723 for that purpose granted, and the same being duly examined
approved, and returned to me in Council the Fifth of this instant, the
said Will was then approved and allowed of, the said deceased having
whilst he lived, and at the time of his death divers goods, rights and
credits within the Province aforesaid, by means whereof the approbation
and allowing of his Testament, and the power of granting the adminis-
tration of all and singular the goods, rights and credits of the said deceased
and also the winding up the accounts, calculations and reckonings of the said
administration, and the final dismission and discharge from the same to
me is manifestly known to belong, and that the administration of all &
singular the goods, rights and credits of the said deceased, and his said
Testament any manner of way concerning was committed unto Mr. John
Barnwell, named Executor in the said Will and Testament, being forth-
with in the holy Evangelical way and faithfully to administer the same
and to make a full and perfect Inventory of all and singular the goods,
rights and credits of the said deceased, and to exhibit the same unto the
Secretary's Office at Charles City and Port, at or before the Eighteenth
day of February next ensuing, and to render a true and just account, —
