Know Ye that on the thirty first day of July, in the Year of our
said One Thousand Seven hundred and Twenty Three, at His Majesty's
Precinct Court, in Colleton County in the Province aforesaid, before the
Judges Commissioners and authorized for the said Precinct, in open Court
the last Will and Testament of John Pinney, late of the County aforesaid,
died, the copy whereof is to these presents annexed, was proved, and the
same exhibited and certified to me, in Council, on the sixteenth day of
April, in the Year of our Lord One Thousand Seven hundred and twenty

Seven hundred and Eighty Shillings, being one full third part of all the
negroes now alive in the possession of Samuel Morris for the uses
mentioned in one Deed of Trust, Tripartite, confirmed by Rebecca
Emberston late Rebecca Livingston dec: as by the said Deed Relat:
thereunto being had, doth more at large appear. And Thos:
Pagit do hereby discharge the said Sam: Morris for ever in behalf of
Wife, Unge and my heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns and do
acknowledge my self fully satisfied and contented with my abovesaid share
part. Witness my hand the day and year first above named Thos: Pagit
being present as Witnesses Thos: Elliott, William Elliott, Thos: Fairchild
Thos: Pagit doe promise, covenant and agree to and with y: abovesaid
said Sam: Morris his heirs, Executors, Administrators and Assigns to
account with, reimburse and pay unto y: said Sam: Morris one full
third part of the charges, costs and expenses of the said Estates being repaid
and maintained against the demands of Henry Livingston, and the fees
that are necessary to preserving the same. Witness my hand this 16th of
